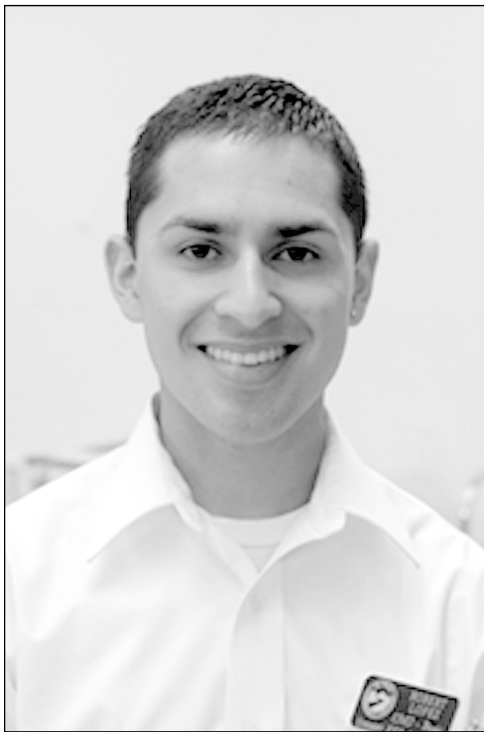

Juarez, Lopez named Gates Scholarship recipients

Two Socorro ISD students were selected as recipients of the Gates Millennium Scholars program. El Dorado High School senior Theresa Juarez and Socorro High School senior Robert Lopez were named as Gates scholars in April. As recipients, both will have their tuition, books, fees and other associated costs for paid by the scholarship. Juarez will be going to the California Institute of Technology to study aeronautics and Lopez will be going to Texas Tech University to study physical therapy.

"I am really excited to be able to pursue my goals without having to worry about any financial problems," said Juarez who is also a National Hispanic Scholar and was named to the Texas All-Academic Volleyball team. Juarez will be heading to California to continue her studies. "I visited the college and saw this department had the most enthusiastic students and my advisor is a post-doctorate student in aeronautics."

Juarez is in the International Baccalaureate program at El Dorado and will be amongst its first graduates. She has been at El Dorado since 8th grade and went to school at Elfida P. Chavez Elementary, Helen Ball Elementary, and Jane

Hambric School. She is also a member of the Mayor's 100 Teens program sponsored by El Paso Mayor John Cook.

"Her focus on academics started as a freshman and has stayed constant throughout her high school career keeping her in the top ten of her class," said Lizett Shaw, ELA Department Chair and IB Coordinator. "Combined with her desire to continue her education and the courage to take on the challenges that college with provide, I believe that Theresa will thrive in the rigorous academic setting at Cal Tech.

"This takes a big weight off my shoulders," said Lopez who is an athletic trainer for Socorro High School. Lopez, who is in the Health Professions Academy at Socorro High School and taking part in the school's EMT certification program in partnership with El Paso Community College, plans on studying physical therapy.

Both students were selected in March 2008 to advance to the second phase of the Gates Millennium Scholars (GMS) screening and selection process. The Gates Millennium Scholars (GMS), funded by a grant from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, was established in 1999 to reward scholarships to outstanding, low income African American, American Indian/Alaska Natives, Asian Pacific Islander American, and Hispanic Americans.

Preventing child abuse

In 1983, to raise awareness of the troubling prevalence of child abuse in the United States, Congress officially designated the month of April as National Child Abuse Prevention Month. In 2006, there were over 900,000 confirmed reports of child abuse or neglect, and over 1,500 children died tragically at the hands of abusers. However, the actual number of abused children is much higher, since most cases involving abuse and neglect go unreported or unnoticed.

Sadly, just this month El Pasoans were painfully reminded of the seriousness of child abuse in our community. Milayna Harris, the 2-year old daughter of Fort Bliss soldiers stationed overseas, died tragically due to blunt force injuries she sustained by her own godparents. And last November, police found the badly abused body of three year old Jacqueline Gonzalez in a plastic storage bin in the trunk of her parents' car. Jacqueline's mother and common-law husband were charged with injury to a child resulting in death, and the case is still pending.

The fact that these children were killed by the same adults entrusted to protect and care for them is a tragedy itself. According to the federal

government's Child Welfare Information Gateway, nearly 80 percent of reported cases of child abuse and neglect were perpetrated by one or both parents. For this reason, most cases of abuse go unreported. If a child's own parents are responsible for inflicting abuse, these victims often have no one else to whom they can turn. Therefore, everyone has a duty to raise awareness about the prevalence of child abuse in our community and notify authorities if they suspect a child is being abused or neglected.

Doing the right thing is not always easy, and this is particularly true when it comes to reporting abuse. People are often afraid to notify authorities when they witness or suspect child abuse, particularly when it is committed by a family member or a friend. Some people turn a blind eye and minimize the abuse or simply dismiss it as a parent disciplining their child. It is important for people to understand that abuse is abuse, no matter who is doing it. When children suffer physical or sexual abuse, they are at high risk for developing long-term physical and psychological ailments in adulthood such as depression and anxiety. Abused children are also more likely to develop behavior problems that often result in drug or alcohol abuse and high risk behavior. It is critical that individuals report suspected

cases of child abuse so these young victims receive the care, treatment, and attention they need to minimize long term problems.

In 1997, my colleagues and I founded the Missing and Exploited Children Caucus in Congress, and I have focused on the issue of child abuse and neglect since I first arrived in Washington, D.C. The Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act of 1974 was the first federal legislation passed that provided federal funding to states in support of prevention investigation, prosecution, and treatment of children who have suffered abuse. In 2003, my colleagues and I re-authorized this legislation as the Keeping Children and Families Safe Act. In 2006, Congress passed, and the President signed into law, the Adam Walsh Child Protection and Safety Act, imposing tougher penalties for child abusers and sex offenders. We in Congress will continue to ensure that our federal laws protect those who are most vulnerable and impose tough penalties for child abusers.

Here at home, we are fortunate to have the The Advocacy Center for the Children of El Paso, which has been a tremendous resource for the victims of child abuse in our community. I recently had the opportunity to speak at the Advocacy Center and meet with the center's staff and other community leaders to help raise awareness of child abuse in our community. The Advocacy Center works in partnership with local law enforcement, prosecutors, and child protective and health care agencies to provide victimized children with a safe and nurturing environment in the aftermath of their abuse. In this environment, children are able to feel more comfortable when communicating with adults, and law enforcement officers and prosecutors can acquire the evidence they need to secure the convictions of alleged abusers.

We all have a duty to notify authorities if we suspect child abuse or neglect. If you suspect that a child is being abused or neglected, please contact the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services at 1-800-252-2500. If you believe a child requires immediate assistance, call 911.

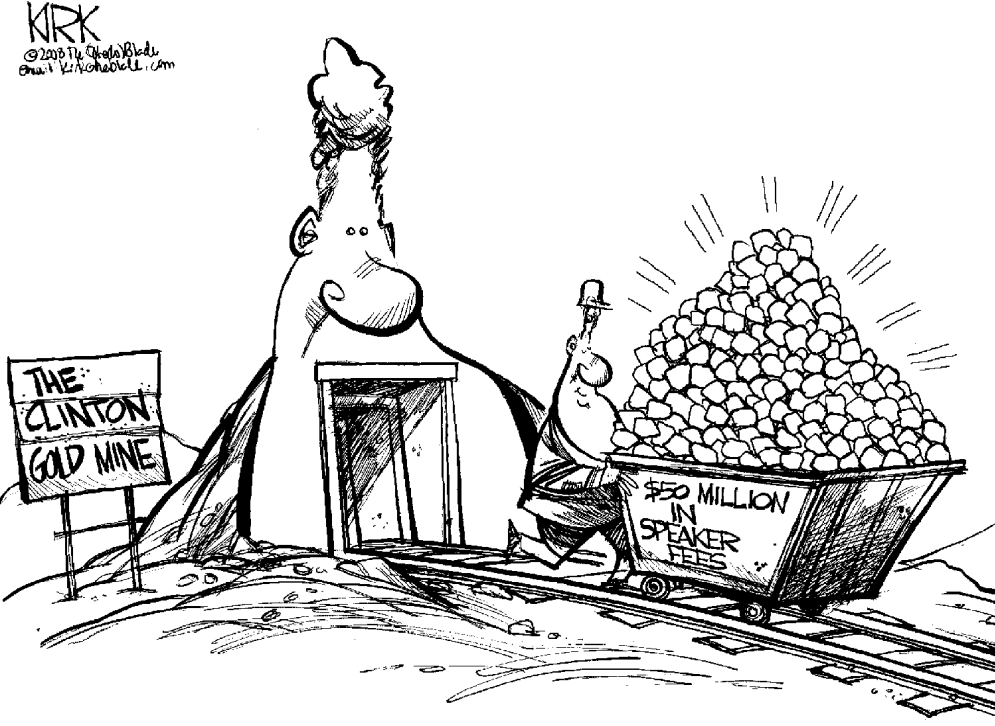
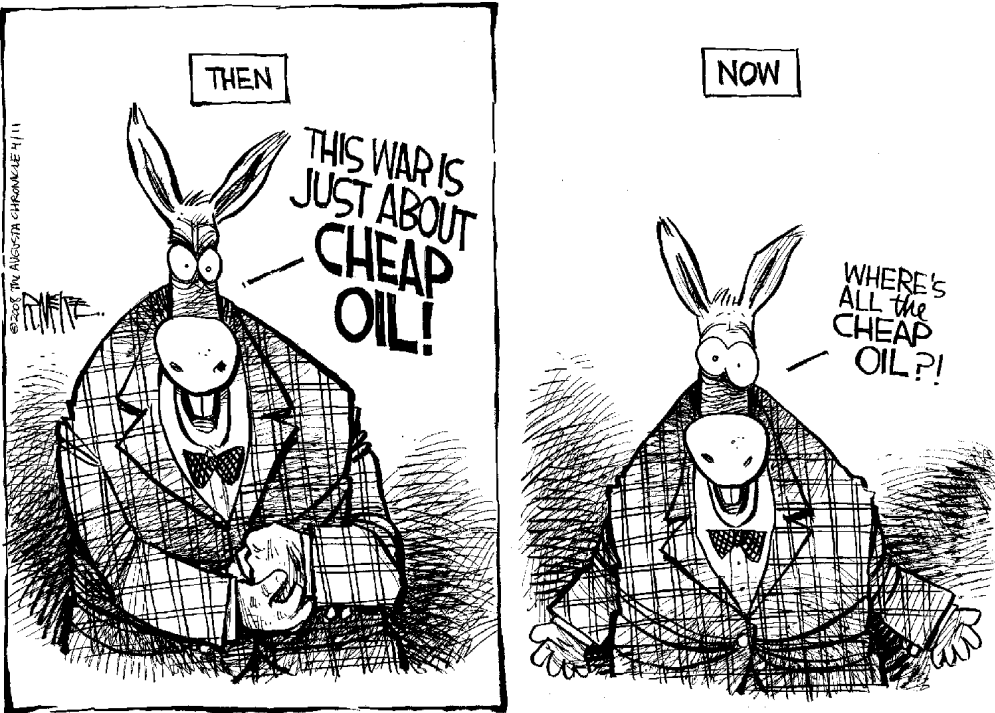

Locksmith licenses

Hola, mi gente. Most of you who keep abreast of current events are informed more about city and county government actions. State agencies generally do not receive as much press but they do impact our lives tremendously.

One of my priorities as your state representative has been to provide a conduit to those agencies for the constituents in District 75. As the elected state official, I get the ear of the agency directors who in turn help me assist you.

Several weeks ago, I received a letter from the West Texas Locksmith Association. The information contained in the letter was quite disturbing.

According to the research done by the Association, thirty six of the sixty one locksmith companies listed in the yellow pages were offering their services even though they were not legally licensed to do so. The purpose for licensing locksmiths is to assure the public that neither criminals nor sex offenders have the opportunity of setting locks in a home, business or automobile.

I sent a letter to the chairman of the Private Security Bureau, a branch of the Texas Department of Safety. During the same period, Representative Joe Pickett, who also received the same letter, took action regarding this public hazard as well. He had made some telephone calls asking for action.

Between his calls and my letter, we made the Department of Public Safety aware of the situation. In my letter, I requested that the Department make available additional personnel from other parts of the state to assist our local office in enforcing the law.

Late in March, the action that Representative Pickett and I requested was initiated. A task force, which included U. S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), El Paso County Precinct 1 Constables Office and Justice of the Peace, Commissioners Court and the District Attorney's office, cooperated in a targeted operation that resulted in ten arrests; seven individuals from locksmith companies and three from alarm companies.

Those ten were charged with a Class A misdemeanor prohibiting an individual from offering or providing locksmith services. Notwithstanding the relevance of the arrests, my office was informed that the local office, staffed by only one capable trooper, received a flood of phone calls from the unlicensed companies requesting the opportunity to apply for or renew their license. This is perhaps the more important outcome. El Pasoans need the services of locksmiths so it would be imprudent to criminalize their licensing oversights.

You, the public, also have a responsibility in the enforcement of the laws. If you need a locksmith, make the effort to confirm the license prior to the service being rendered. If not possible, at least confirm after the work is performed.

Taxpayers can check refunds with 'Where's My Refund?'

WASHINGTON — Taxpayers who have filed their federal income tax returns and are expecting their refunds can use the Internal Revenue Service's online tool, "Where's My Refund?" to check on the status of their refunds.

"Where's My Refund?" is fast, easy, safe and convenient. Nearly 9.7 million taxpayers have checked the status of their 2007 federal income tax refunds.

To get to personalized refund information, taxpayers should be ready to enter their:

- Social Security Number (or Taxpayer Identification Number),
- Filing status (Single, Married Filing Joint Return, Married Filing Separate Return, Head of Household, or Qualifying Widow(er)),
- Refund amount shown on their tax returns.

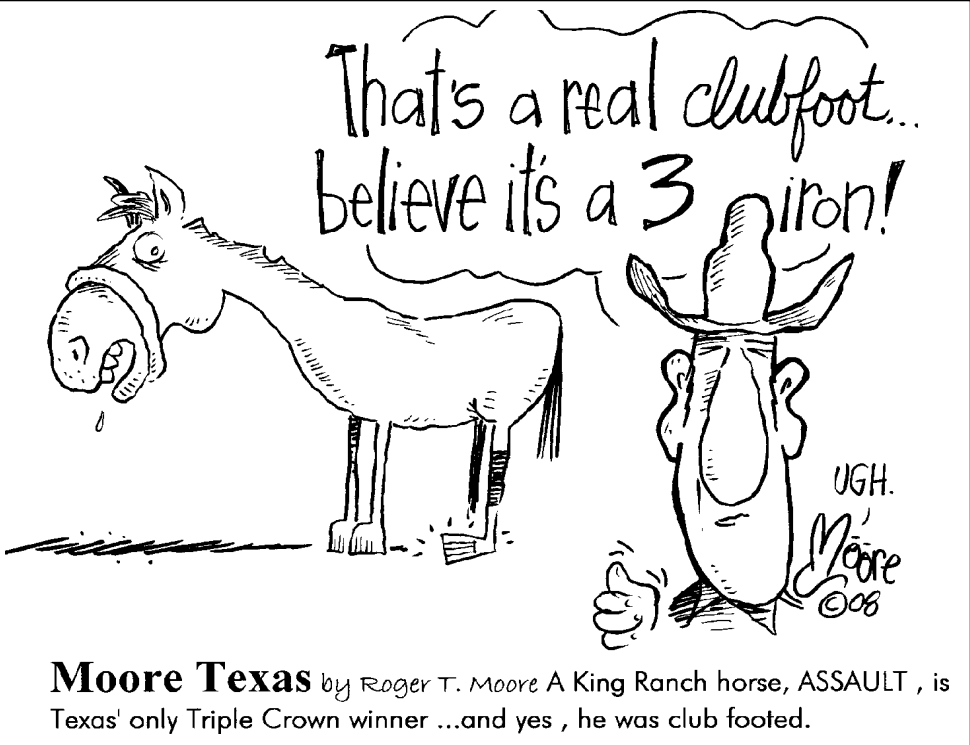
Taxpayers can check on the status of their refund seven days after e-filing a return. For a paper return, check four to six weeks after mailing the return.

"Where's My Refund?" also includes links to customized information based on a taxpayer's specific situation.

If 28 days have passed after the IRS says it mailed a check, taxpayers can initiate a trace.

New this year Spanish-speaking taxpayers can get information about the status of their federal refunds using *Dónde Está mi Reembolso?* available by entering the Spanish language area of the web site by clicking the Espanol link on IRS.gov. The refund trace and address change features are only available in English at this time.

But be cautious — some scam artists are sending phony emails, including those relating to "Where's My Refund?," to trick individuals into revealing personal financial information that can be used to access their financial accounts. People who want to access the genuine IRS Web site and the "Where's My Refund?" feature should go directly to the IRS Web site by typing the address, www.irs.gov, into the address line of their Internet window. The only genuine IRS Web site is IRS.gov.

Top three finishers in the regional events will advance to the state finals, which will be held in May in Austin.

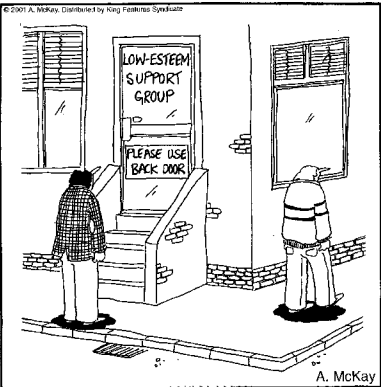

Barbee has said all the usual things about not being offered the job yet and being happy at UTEP.

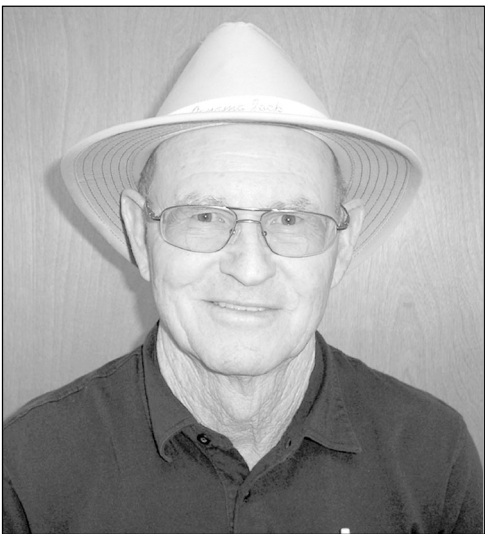
The second-year UTEP coach played at UMass and coached there before going to Memphis.

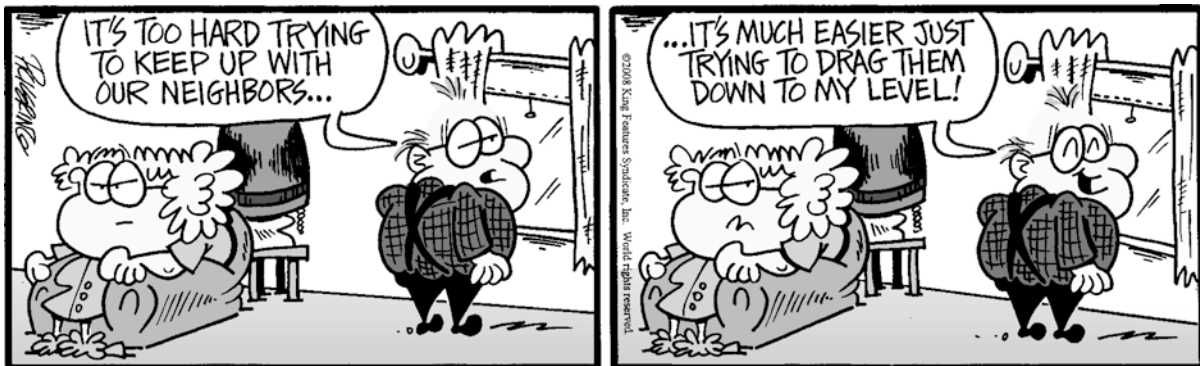

Stay in touch — 24/7

Put down that cell phone and read the following health bulletin: You may already be suffering from nomophobia.

It is not, as you might expect, the fear of *nomos*. Instead, “nomophobia” is short for “no mobile phobia,” the debilitating fear of being out of mobile phone contact.

Despite the recent study, we are still a long way off from the condition being officially recognized as a genuine medical problem with established protocols, treatment and, of course, repulsive pharmaceutical ads on TV — perhaps by next Tuesday.

(I admit to a “pharmaphobia,” a fear of televised drug advertising, which at first appears to offer a treatment for a real or imagined disease, only to tell you that that the drug itself may have side effects such as causing your elbows to fall off.)

But already the study has turned up an important breakthrough — the discovery of a catchy name that journalists can latch onto, and, also important, an official-sounding portion of the population that suffers from the disease — 53 percent.

That's right, more than half the people in your home or office are suffering (though, doctors note, not silently since they tend to spend a lot of time gabbing on the phone).

The story, however, did omit one key statistic that's crucial to the success of any new disorder — the cost to society.

Many people ignored hangnails, for example, until it was revealed that they cost the U.S. economy \$83 billion in lost productivity *per year* — and that doesn't include one lingering hangnail that I bravely worked through despite searing pain.

Fortunately, as someone who once scored an Honorable Mention for a fifth-grade science fair project that depicted the earth-moon system with startling realism — except perhaps for the pipe cleaner that held the moon in orbit — I have a full understanding of the underlying principles needed to generate these figures.

Here's how it works. Take the year you were born — in my case, '57 — and multiply it by the number of your birth month, which for me is five.

That gives you a total of 285, which means, in this case, that the total cost to society of untreated nomophobia is \$285 billion.

Unless of course you'd prefer a bigger number, like \$285 trillion or \$285 bobobillion. The bigger the better.

And right now, there's no cure; the article even offered the ludicrous advice of telling people to "liberate yourself from the shackles of your mobile by simply switching it off."

Yeah, right.

According to a comment accompanying the article, people's attachment to cell phones is such that one man observed a child text messaging in church, which he considered a sign of moral decay — though it's possible the girl was simply texting the sermon to all of her friends.

Not much else is known about nomophobia except that it appears to be of recent origin. A careful review of the medical literature for the 17th through 19th centuries revealed not a single verifiable case of the disease.

But if you do come across some information, give me a call. My phone is always on.

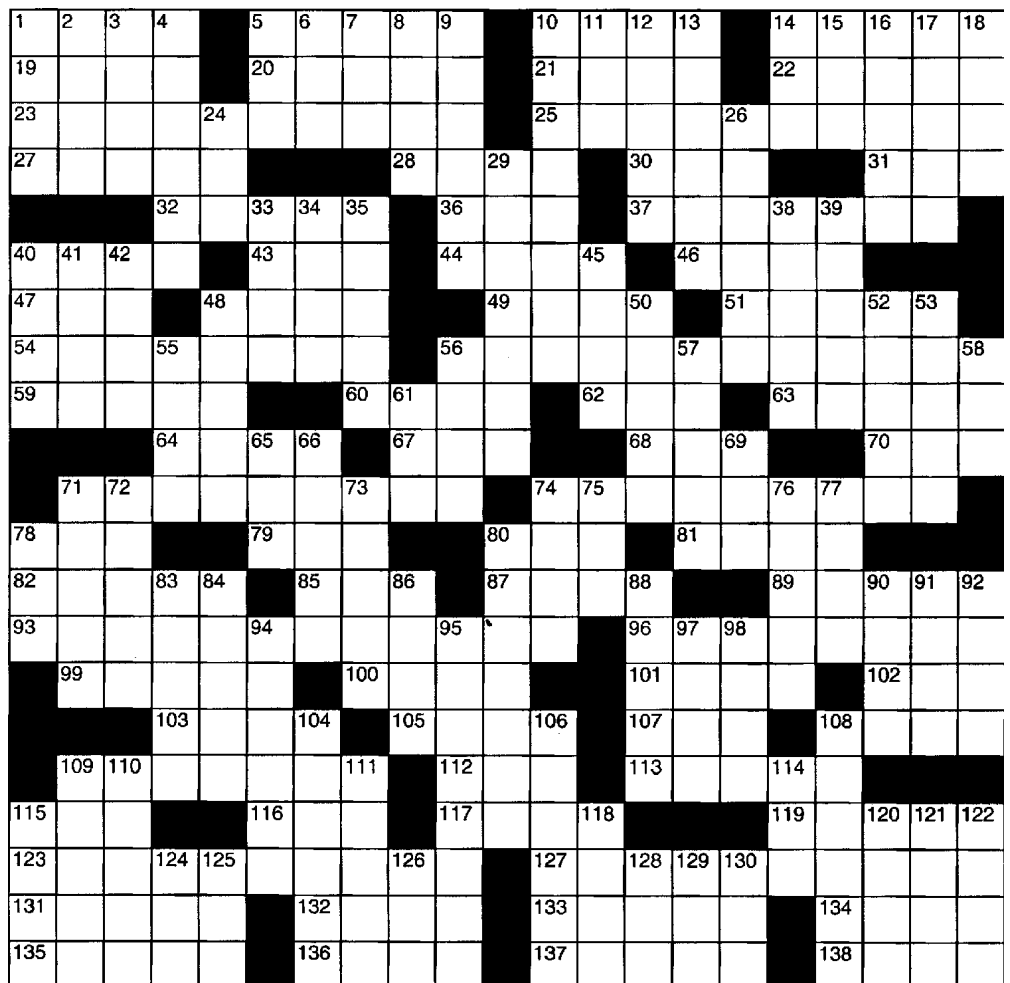
