### Clint ISD taxes

Clint ISD Board of Trustees, at a special board meeting held August 26, 2009, adopted a balanced budget of \$74.9 million for the 2009-2010 school year. In addition, federal stimulus and stabilization funds will provide the District with additional resources to expand and enhance instructional programs. Taxpayers will not see an increase to the tax rate for this school year. The tax rate for the year, also approved by the board, will remain at \$1.335050 per \$100.00 of taxable property value. The average net taxable value, for a single family dwelling, in the District is currently \$71,369.

### San Eli salaries

The San Elizario ISD (SEISD) Board of Trustees voted to raise salaries at a special board meeting on August 25 in order to hire and retain top-notch teachers and staff. After an extensive salary review which included comparing pay scales for different groups of employees, SEISD will be able to continue providing desirable and competitive salaries in the region. The school board approved the following salary increases:

- Teachers and all personnel tied to the teacher pay scale will receive a step increase.
- Teachers will receive a \$1,300 increase (\$800 mandated/funded by House Bill 3646).
- Classroom teachers will also receive a \$2,000 retention incentive.
- All support staff will receive a three percent increase.
- Administrative personnel will receive a two percent increase.

## Horizon Regional MUD holds tax rate for eighth straight year

HORIZON — The Board of Directors of the Horizon Regional Municipal Utility District (HRMUD) have held taxes at the same rate as they have for the past eight years. Eight years ago the HRMUD tax rate was lowered one-cent from .047 to .046 per \$100 valuation.

Despite recent tax increases from many other city and county governmental entities, the HRMUD board feels it is important to hold the line on taxes.

"Even though the voters approved a \$45 million bond eight years ago we have managed to hold tax costs, over the years, due to excellent planning, good management and knowl-

edgeable advisors," said Board President John Navidomskis.

He added, "When elected officials pay the same taxes as those who elected them, we like to see zero increases in our yearly taxes. The Central Appraisal District (CAD) often increases evaluations to raise more money. In effect a tax increase combined with a CAD increase becomes burdensome on the property owners."

"Often, when a property owner views their bill from the CAD they see an increase from the year before. This is not the action of the HRMUD Board of the Directors," Navidomskis points out.

HRMUD covers over 140 square miles — the largest MUD in Texas. It serves Horizon City, El Paso Hills, Green Desert, Lakeway, Agua Dulce and other neighborhoods along Asencion.

## Don't be in the dark about your child's daycare facility

Virginia Gonzalez of Deer Park had long known that she loved kids, and that her dream job was to operate her own child daycare center. Thanks to a tip from a savvy friend, she soon learned another fact: Businesses like the one she planned to open are regulated and licensed by the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS).

So, before she opened the doors to Vicky's Daycare, she made a point of contacting the local DFPS office and getting a copy of a booklet that covers all the basics of state daycare regulation, including the specific areas that inspectors cover during their inspections.

The registration and licensure process, Gonzalez learned, was thorough but readily manageable. "I prepared myself very well, and got all the advice I needed from my friend and the people at the agency," Gonzalez said. "I was confident we'd do well. And knew that getting the license was something you've got to do."

Her commitment to following the law has made her five-year-old business a success and earned it a no-deficiencies report during her most recent inspection.

Gonzalez knew, of course, that many daycare homes and centers operate under the regulatory and licensing radar — sometimes knowingly, sometimes not. The total number of these illegal centers is unknown, but one thing they have in common is lack of assurance for parents who want safe, competent care for their children.

Restoring that confidence is the goal of DFPS' Don't Be in the Dark public awareness campaign ([www.dontbeinthedark.org](http://www.dontbeinthedark.org)), which educates parents about the dangers of illegal child care and to urges unlicensed operators to "step into the light, get inspected and get licensed."

This isn't about jumping through bureaucratic hoops, the agency stresses; it's about protecting the safety — even lives — of Texas kids. In 2007, 13 children died in unregulated care, in addition to 18 in 2006. The conditions that caused these deaths ranged from unsafe play equipment to inadequate supervision to fire hazards and other dangerous physical conditions in the facility. Illegal daycare facilities also are less likely to do criminal background checks on their employees.

These and other safety deficiencies can be hard to spot, even for observant parents. That's why DFPS urges parents to follow these steps before placing their children in any daycare facility:

Search online for day care providers at [www.txchildcaresearch.org](http://www.txchildcaresearch.org). This database will give you a list of providers with services that meet your specifications, including their locations and phone numbers. The site also gives their licensing histories and level of compliance with minimum health and safety standards.

If you don't have Internet access, call 866-TX-CHILD for assistance.

Visit the daycare facilities you're considering. Talk face to face with the caregivers and see how they interact with the kids. If other parents are there, talk to them as well.

Comptroller accountability

Hola, mi gente. Recently, I met with the owner of a premier restaurant bar in El Paso. He informed me that he had some serious concerns about recent audits done on his business by the comptroller.

For the purpose of background, when a person is issued a license to sell liquor, either in a bar or a restaurant bar, the Licensing and Regulatory Commission has the Comptroller check the receipts of license owners. This is to confirm that the licensee is paying the amount of taxes that are due based on the amount of liquor purchased.

The local restaurant owner informed me that he has had two audits in the past five years and in each he has been levied tens of thousands of dollars for delinquent taxes, interests and penalties. He felt that the charges were unfair.

When an audit is performed, normally the auditor is looking at the records for the past four years. That is an incredible amount of receipts to look at.

However, the local owner said that the auditor randomly selected monthly records and penalized the owner from that. I thought that the penalties were for the specific months

audited, but I was wrong. The restaurant owner informed me that the actual penalties were arrived at from projections based on mathematical probabilities. I was astounded.

In other words, our local businessman was penalized over \$30,000 (double his previous audit) on back taxes that were based on mathematical projections. No other business pays taxes on an accounting formula; they are taxed on actual confirmed sales.

I wrote the Comptroller to inquire

about this rather peculiar means of figuring back taxes. That office confirmed that formulas are indeed used to collect back taxes and to penalize license owners.

I also requested that the comptroller provide me with a spreadsheet of the last 50 audits done in El Paso, Dallas, Houston, San Antonio and Austin. To my surprise, El Paso had the highest total dollars; \$2,249,406 in deficiencies (back taxes only, not including interest and penalty). Travis county (city of Austin) had only \$377,268 in deficiencies. There is something definitely wrong with this picture.

I have requested that the speaker include this in committee hearings

leading up to the next session. The hearings would be, if accepted by the speaker, held by the Licensing and Administrative Procedures Committee of which I am a member. I also plan to ask the State Office of the Auditor to perform an audit of the procedures used by the comptroller so that I can gauge the fairness. Whenever El Paso pays more to the state than the other four largest cities in the state, I immediately get very concerned. After all, these penalties ultimately affect consumers like you in the pocket-book.

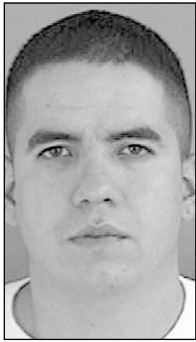

Crime Stoppers

Crime Stoppers of El Paso is assisting officers from the Special Traffic Investigations Unit (STI) of the El Paso Police Department in identifying and locating a suspect who ran down an elderly gentleman on a bicycle, killing him and fleeing, making this the Crime of the Week. On Sunday, June 21, just before 7:00 a.m., STI investigators responded to assist Pebble Hills Patrol with a traffic fatality. Their investigation revealed that 67-year-old Heinz Duerkop was riding a bicycle south in the 3400 block

of George Dieter, when he was struck from behind by a vehicle. Duerkop was thrown from the bicycle and died at the scene. The vehicle's driver failed to stop and render aid, instead fleeing the scene. At this time, the vehicle is believed to be white in color and possibly sustained damage to the front end and hood. The victim came to El Paso as an officer in the German Army, settled here, became a U.S. citizen, and had been a volunteer at Hueco Tanks Historical Site for the past ten years.
