Crime stoppers

Someone uses rocks to smash the windows of many vehicles in the area around Ramona Elementary School, located in the central part of town, causing thousands of dollars of damage and making this the Crime Stoppers "Crime of the Week." Over the night-time hours of Saturday and Sunday, December 25 and 26, 2010, the unknown subjects used large river rocks to smash the front and back windshields and side passenger windows of at least nine vehicles, also denting the hoods and roofs of several involved vehicles. The damage to all the vehicles is more than \$8,000.00 and, because the damage was done during the early morning hours, there is little information about the suspects or the vehicle they may have used. However, this is not the only incident of this type to happen recently. Since the end of 2010, many neighborhoods on the eastside have also been vandalized: fenders dented, windows smashed, and lights broken out - some possibly with baseball bats - as well as shots from BB guns. Many more dollars of damage were totaled in these incidents. El Paso passport agency to open in March

El Paso, a major port-of-entry hub into Mexico, will finally have a full-fledged passport agency that promises to eliminate long lines; and in some cases, an individual may get a passport in one day.

The new Passport Agency is scheduled to Clerk's Office in the County Courthouse in

Building in Downtown El Paso. The new agency will issue passport books and passport cards onsite. The Bureau of Diplomatic Security, a federal agency that focuses on passport and visa fraud, will also have an office in the historic building.

"People will still be able to apply for passports at the post office and at the District

open in March in the newly renovated Mills Downtown. But the El Paso Passport Agency is expected to carry the load, and that will make for smoother operations at the other sites," stated Vincent Perez, a staffer for U.S. Representative Silvestre Reyes.

The U.S. State Department allocated about \$2.1 million in federal stimulus money for the El Paso agency. Plans for the new facility call for nine public counters and a lobby able to accommodate 75 customers at a time. The office is expected to create at least 37 job positions.

"El Paso needs this quicker, more-efficient service because so many citizens find they are required to commute back and forth to Juárez daily. When the federal government decided five such new agencies should be federally funded it was only common sense they heeded Reyes' request for an office here, because El Paso is the largest big city in the U.S. that is situated directly on the border with Mexico," stated Perez.

According to the Congressman's office, some 4,000 El Pasoans commute to work in Juárez maquiladoras on weekdays. And, at the El Paso District Clerk's Office alone about 150 passports are processed every week.

"This new passport agency is one of only five new full-fledged agencies in the nation funded by the Recovery Act, which represents another milestone investment for our community. The legislation was passed by Congress and signed by the President in February 2009; one of the very first pieces of legislation signed by President Obama to help move the economy forward," stated Congressman Reyes.

Omar Salgado visits Cauntillo students

CANUTILLO - He is only 17, but El Paso native Omar Salgado already has a long list of accomplishments in the world of soccer.

The tall and still-shy teen has played for national teams, professional squads and just last month he was the overall Nol. 1 pick in the Major League Soccer super draft.

Now, thanks to his visit to Bill Childress Elementary School on Wednesday, Salgado can also add motivational speaker to his

"It's been a wild ride since the draft," Salgado said. "But I'm happy to be back home and to be talking to students. Hopefully I was able to motivate them."

His visit was part of "No Place For Hate," the Canutillo Independent School District's effort to teach students diversity

and prevent bullying.

Salgado told the students that bullying and discrimination are not qualities that make for good soccer players.

"I have played all over the world: Japan, Mexico, Peru," Salgado said. "And everywhere I have played I have learned to accept and admire the differences between myself and the other players.

"That's just what you need to do if you really want to be part of a team," he added.

Salgado will have to learn new customs and cultures as he moves to Vancouver, Canada later this year. He will play for the Vancouver Whitecaps, the newest professional team in Major League Soccer.

Before he settles in Canada, though, he has to go through a round of spring training in Arizona.

Students at Childress said they were happy to have met Salgado. Some said they

no mandates by the state are being reduced or modified. So in order to comply with the same mandates the conservative leadership imposed in the last budget, the reduced funding has to be made up at the local level one way or the other.

While the "no new taxes" fervor is alive and well in every community, the cost of the reduced state revenues cost local communities in a variety of other ways.

If the school districts in our county haven't already made it clear, there will be layoffs. That will also occur in the vast number of state funded agencies. Teachers who just financed their accelerated qualification will have no job to pay for the student loans they took out. The projections from some reliable pundits put the job loss from statewide school districts alone to be in excess of 100,000 jobs. This does not include the job losses at other state funded agencies. Putting a minimum of 100,000 people out of work at the same time is going to hurt the positive direction our state economy has taken in the past few months.

No applesauce?

What kind of hospital doesn't of infections diseases, broken have applesauce? Since time respiratory equipment, diagnostic immemorial, sick people have equipment they're still waiting been taking medications crushed up in applesauce.

Not, apparently, at Cochran Medical Center in St. Louis.

When a male nurse (who's also a veteran) brought in his own supplies – in this case, the applesauce for patients who couldn't swallow whole pills – he was reprimanded.

This one small issue looms large as indicative of bigger problems.

Lest you think I'm picking on Cochran, if you received dental care at Cochran in St. Louis from early 2009 to early 2010, and if you've since moved, the VA might still be looking for you. Dental instruments weren't properly cleaned and some veterans have come down with hepatitis. Some of the veterans who were patients can't be located for testing.

Now nursing staff is coming forward (see the recent issue of Infection Control Today on the Internet) with more information about Cochran. They tell of a lack of disposable personal equipment to prevent the transmission

on after three years, and lack of adequate staff for simple things such as daily baths.

I wonder how much information would be revealed if nurses were given a secure way to provide facts about things they've seen in the medical centers – and have that information sent to those who would respond and act. Let those on the front lines of the hospitals speak up about what's really going on.

The Veterans Administration Office of the Inspector General is due to issue a report in the spring about several medical centers, including Cochran. THE VAOIG always does an excellent job of reporting what it finds. The problem is the powers-that-be who always smile and nod and promise to fix things, then don't.

world, Floyd Patterson. "Hebeatme," Glennacknowledged in a 2004 interview with Seconds Out magazine. "Knocked me down a few times, broke my tooth. But I went the distance."

Glenn retired after the bout,

coming to grips with the fact that he would never rise to the upper echelons of the sport, but he did work hard enough to buy the bar, which ultimately allowed him to run the famed Times Square Boxing Club. And though he worked the corner as Patterson's trainer in his knockout loss to Muhammed Ali, Glenn's gym is credited with doing more than just churning out contenders - it offers every kid a chance to change his life around.

"The best thing about boxing is that it teaches respect," Glenn once said. "You take a kid off the streets. He's angry and scared and beefing about the system. But after a few

weeks in the gym, it's 'yes, sir' and 'no, sir' and the lessons of discipline and hard work set in. Before long, the kid starts to make something out of himself and believe in himself. "Kids in the gym want to learn.

That's why they're there. People hear about the fighters who become champions. But a lot of young men who never go beyond the amateurs get good jobs and become good citizens because of boxing."

There is no finer example of this than Jimmy Glenn.







Your good health By Paul G. Donahue, M.D.

DEAR DR. DONOHUE: Will form, not in its patch form. you please explain vertigo? I fell asleep in a chair one evening, and when I woke, I was slightly dizzy. The next morning when I woke up and sat up, I was extremely dizzy. Everything was going back and forth. When I tried to walk, I was bouncing off the walls. The room was moving. My doctor prescribed Dramamine. I still wake up dizzy, but not as bad as the first two *nights. I am 69. − E.B.*

Vertigo is a hallucination that everything is moving. It's not. What you describe fits the definition. Many causes of vertigo can be traced to the inner ear, which has two important functions: hearing and balance, the orientation of our body to the things around it. That function is handled by the vestibular system of the inner ear.

Sometimes a viral infection of the ear can trigger vertigo. The only way to handle it is to take a medicine such as you're taking and wait for the infection to clear in about three to six weeks.

Or it can come about because tiny calcium particles in the inner ear have made their way to places where they shouldn't be. This is benign positional vertigo. When affected people move their head or change position from lying or sitting to standing, the calcium particles activate the vestibular system abnormally, and profound dizziness strikes. When you woke up and sat up, you became dizzy. You changed positions. Calcium particles activated your vestibular system.

Adoctor easily can prove benign positional vertigo by provoking a dizzy spell through a series of head and body movements. He or she can coax those transplanted calcium specks back to their site of origin through another series of movements, called the Epley So is scopolamine – in its oral Reserved.

I made vertigo sound like an easy diagnosis and an easy treatment; it isn't. Many other serious conditions have to be considered by the examining doctor.

DEAR DR. DONOHUE: My teenage daughter twists and pulls her hair when she reads, watches TV or studies. She has two small bald patches on her scalp. I cannot get her to stop doing this. Is this normal? -R.T.

It's not normal, but it's pretty common. It's trichotillomania (TRICK-oh-TILL-uh-MAYnee-uh). Some classify it as an obsessive compulsive disorder. The hair pulling quiets an inner anxiety. It's almost an involuntary

If you can't get your daughter to stop, the family doctor can recommend a therapist for her. The therapist can explain to her why she does this and how she can curtail the urge. Sometimes, medicines are prescribed for a short period.

She really does need attention. Constant hair pulling can damage the hair roots and lead to a permanent bald patch.



Learn more at A: No. When you reach full retirement age, you no longer need to report your earnings to Social Security. You do, however, need to report earnings for those months in the calendar year before the month you reach full retirement age. For example, if you reach it in May, you would need to report your earnings total for the four earlier months.
