San Elizario ISD was recently notified that the district had scored 19 out of 20 possible points on the ratings criteria for the program. The award designation is valid for one year and signifies that the district is setting the bar high with its transparency efforts. The basic requirements of the Texas Comptroller's Leadership Circle call for districts to post their budget, annual financial report, and check register online for ease of access to taxpayers. Public entities from throughout the state apply annually to receive one of three Leadership Circle designations: bronze, silver or gold. The San Elizario ISD finance department under the leadership of Assistant Superintendent Rena Seifts has posted financial transparency documentation on its webpage that can be found at www. seisd.net/finance.aspx

# San Elizario ISD science teachers are national fellows

In the few short years that Susana Chavez and Ana Luna have been teaching science in the San Elizario Independent School District (SEISD) they have been busy making good use of the resources and tools available to them

for immediate success in the classroom. Recently, these two secondary educators were also chosen as Fellows in the 2011-2012 National Science Teachers Association (NSTA) New Science Teacher Academy that opened up an even wider network of support for them to build their portfolio of teaching experience. The fellowship awards Chavez and Luna a comprehensive NSTA membership, online mentoring and web-based professional

> development opportunities and an all-expenses paid trip to the NSTA National Conference in Indianapolis from March 29 to April 1.

> A total of 215 science teachers nationwide, including 52 from Texas, were selected from the NSTA fellowship. Chavez and Luna are the only two fellows from the El Paso area selected on the basis of showing evidence of a solid science background and a strong interest in growing as a professional science educator. They will participate in a year-long professional development program designed to promote quality science teaching, enhance teacher confidence and classroom excellence and improve teacher content knowledge. Since last summer they have been mentored by a seasoned teacher, have participated in web seminars and completed various assignments to meet the criteria for the fellowship according to Debbie Cortez, SEISD Science Instructional Officer.

There are currently more than 2,700 names in the County's hot checks warrants list that owe local merchants more than \$2.13 million dollars. During last fiscal year (2010-2011) the Hot Check Unit collected more than \$905,000 in outstanding hot checks. So far, during the first 5 months of fiscal year 2011-2012 (October-February), the County Attorney's Office has collected over \$330,000.

Bernal is encouraging individuals with outstanding warrants for writing hot checks to take advantage of this opportunity. In order to facilitate the payment of outstanding amounts, County Attorney's Office will be accepting payment plans for qualifying individuals.

"For many years now, the County Attorney's Office has been supporting local businesses by collecting their insufficient funds checks at no cost. We believe the public display of the names of individuals with warrants might serve as a deterrent for hot checks writers, and will motivate some of them to come forward to pay any outstanding amounts before they face serious consequences," Bernal said. "Hot check writers who do not seize this opportunity will be arrested and will face criminal charges."

# Tax amnesty is bad idea

a public notice that a business tax amnesty will be in place from June 12 through August 17, 2012. The amnesty is actually for penalties and interest that are levied for delinquent taxes.

It sure sounds exciting that the state can expect to collect tens of millions of dollars that businesses did not pay as required by state law. I just wonder why it even exists.

Sure, there is a solid incentive to pay the delinquent taxes. But why are the taxes delinquent?

When you go to a business and pay them money, do you hold back on paying the taxes? No, that does not happen if you want the

You are given a receipt that shows the items you bought, the cost for each and then, in a separate entry, the tax that you had to pay. There is no mystery about how much the tax

In the last such event, which is called Fresh Start, the comptroller boasted that an incredible \$100 million dollars in delinquent taxes. Sales taxes that were collected totaled \$47 million.

The question is: Why are these sales taxes not being paid and why are scofflaws being rewarded by avoiding penalties? As I wrote before, if a sales tax is owed, it is because a law abiding Texan paid it for services or products. There is no figuring a percentage of a payment at the end of the year, the tax is figured at the moment of sale.

There should be no amnesty for any business that fails to pay the sales taxes to the state. The comptroller should maintain the record of a business that is delinquent. There should be and public servant, Chente por la gente.

Hola, mi gente. The state comptroller issued elevating penalties for those who are repeat offenders.

> The \$47 million the comptroller collected in 2007 stayed in the accounts of those businesses earning interest. Those businesses benefited by not paying the taxes timely; and then the comptroller compounded that by not assessing penalties.

> I wish the state government were that easy on all of us. Have you ever been ticketed for an expired license or inspection sticker a year later and had your fines waived? Of course not.

> The comptroller's office uses revenues from interest and penalty to finance a portion of its budget. By granting the amnesty, the comptroller is essentially adding to the budget shortfalls. Even if it is a very small amount, the amnesty causes money to be diverted from other programs in order to cover the shortfall. That is irresponsible action by the elected official in charge of our revenue collection.

> The 2007 amnesty also collected \$46 million in franchise taxes that were delinquent. I can't blame businesses on that one. The conservative leadership created such a confusing method of figuring a business's tax liability when the law was passed creating it.

> You may recall the franchise tax was created to fill in the shortfall when school property tax rates were reduced by 1/3. That tax has never generated the projected revenues for our schools. The deficit has lingered around a \$2 billion level.

> That reason should be enough to be stricter on penalizing delinquent businesses instead of granting amnesties.

### DPS issues VETERAN designation on drivers' licenses

The Department of Public Safety will now include the designation "VETERAN" on the face of any class or type of Texas driver license issued to a veteran.

To be eligible, a person must have served in the Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, or Marine Corps of the United States or served in the Texas National Guard, Texas Army and Air National Guard, and must have been honorably discharged, to qualify for the special designation.

Veterans who are not United States citizens but served and received an honorable discharge from one of the services are eligible to receive the veteran designation on their Texas driver license upon request.


However, the veteran must have received an honorable discharge or general (under honorable conditions) from the branch of service in which they served to have the designation placed on his or her driver license.

To initiate the process, a veteran should visit a driver license office and request to have the veteran designation placed on their driver license. Veterans must provide military

(DD-214, documents DD-215) signifying they received an honorable discharge. Once the veteran status has been recorded, military documents will not be required to maintain the veteran designation on subsequent transactions.

Texas veterans, are living out of state, may request the veteran designation by mail. Also, disabled veterans, who provide proof of a servicerelated disability of at least 60 percent, will not be charged a fee for any driver license or identification card transaction.

Over the last couple of decade we've learned of organizations that... well, let's just say are not the best environment for young boys.

First they deny that anything even happened, then they accuse the accusers of lying or misremembering, then they are confronted with overwhelming damaging evidence, and then they admit the crime and tearfully beg for forgiveness.

You would think that all the bad press the scouts and the church have received over the years would scare other entities from indulging in the same behavior.

We all know about the Jerry Sandusky incident at Penn State. His sexual abuse and the attempted cover-up cost Joe Paterno his

It also cost the school president and athletic director their jobs, because they did absolutely nothing about the scandal until it was way out

Then there was the Bernie Fine case at Syracuse.

The head basketball coach Jim Boeheim quickly accused the accusers of lying for financial gain and virtually guaranteeing everyone that his assistant coach was

But when overwhelming evidence came out again Fine, an embarrassed Boeheim found himself recanting his previous statements.

Now there is news out of the University of Wisconsin-Madison, that John Chadima, the school's recent former assistant athletic director, was involved in sexual improprieties with young men.

Chadima was suspended and then resigned in January after a male student employee accused him of sexual assault at a pre-Rose Bowl party in December.

Two other males have also come forward, accusing Chadima of the same kind of thing. One of the accusers is a former football

There is Don Peters, who coached the 1984 USA women's gymnastics team. Two athletes said he sexually abused them as girls.

USA Swimming announced in 2010, that it has come to light that many of their coaches had been sexually abusing kids for decades.

Even Sugar Ray Leonard, the 1976 gold medal winning boxer, admitted to being molested by an assistant Olympic coach.







#### Your good health By Paul G. Donahue, M.D.

DEAR DR. DONOHUE: How does one eliminate dandruff? I have had it for months and have tried many, many shampoos without making any progress. I can't wear a dark suit coat. I look like I've just come in from a snow blizzard. Please give me some sort of program that DEAR DR. DONOHUE: My I can follow. – H.H.

Dandruff's official name is seborrheic (SEB-uh-REE-ik) dermatitis. "Dermatitis" indicates skin inflammation. Seborrhea is an overproduction of oil, sebum. Many with dandruff deny they have an oily scalp. They say their scalp is dry. That can be the case, but seborrheic dermatitis flourishes on skin with an abundance of oil glands. The scalp is one of those places, but not the only place. The flakes that land on your shoulders are sloughed-off skin cells. Dandruff dislodges the dead skin cells.

I'm sure you have tried many shampoos. Let me suggest ones that contain salicylic acid, zinc or selenium. Scalpicin, Head and Shoulders and Selsun Blue are three brand names. There are others. Massage it into your scalp, and let the shampoo remain on your scalp for five minutes. Do this for a minimum of three weeks. If you have an improvement, you can cut back on your shampooing to every other day.
