Crime Stoppers

A woman's credit card is compromised and thousands of dollars of merchandise are purchased without her permission, making this the Crime Stoppers "Crime of the Week." On Monday, July 16, 2012, a woman discovered that her credit card had been cloned by an unknown offender who used it to purchase more than \$5,000 in merchandise within 30 minutes. The woman still had the credit card in her possession but, somehow, the offender managed to obtain her account information to create a duplicate card with a false name on it. The false card was used between 6:00 and 6:30 p.m. at Toys R Us at Gateway & McRae; K-Mart on McRae, and Walgreen's on Wedgewood. Surveillance video from the stores shows the same subject used the card. He is described as an Hispanic man in his 30s, medium height, and thin build. He was last seen wearing a dark baseball cap, a collared long-sleeve shirt with blue, back and white crisscrossed stripes, and blue jeans. Archeology museum presents story of 21st century Maya Woman

Dr. Christine Eber, anthropologist and professor emerita at New Mexico State University, met Antonia,

a Tzotzil-Maya woman from the highlands of Chiapas, Mexico in 1986, and she has followed her life's journey ever since.

Together they have written a book titled, The Journey of a Tzotzil-Maya Woman: Pass Well over the Earth. It is Antonia's life story in her own words, and it will be featured in a special presentation by Eber at 2 p.m., Saturday, Sept. 8, at the El Paso Museum of Archaeology, 4300 Transmountain Road.

In her presentation, Eber will read passages from Antonia's book and discuss the process of writing her life story. The book details the challenges and rewards they experienced working to organize weaving cooperatives and to support the struggle for social justice in Chiapas.

"With so many stories of violence and social

life story provides a vision of hope through its focus on building a new world, one free of want and injustice," Eber stated. "Antonia's journey is about hope and resistance, about one Maya woman's persistence in the face of poverty and racism, and doing so in solidarity

with others," she added.

Eber has written other books including Women and Alcohol in a Highland Maya Town: Water of Hope; Water of Sorrow; and Women of Chiapas: Making History in Times of Struggle and Hope (co-edited with Christine Kovic).

Eber is also founding member of Weaving for Justice (formerly Las Cruces-Chiapas Connection) that is a volunteer network that assists Chiapas weavers with selling their products through fair trade.

The special presentation is being held in conjunction with the exhibit, Look Close See Far, A Cultural Portrait of the Maya and the Tzotzil Maya textiles, which is on display at the museum. The event is

New identification rules for vehicle titling, registration

Texans titling a vehicle in the state and first-time registrants will soon have to show identification, enhancing public safety and paving the way for more customer-friendly automation.

The Texas Department of Motor Vehicles (TxDMV) Board passed new identification rules at its Thursday meeting. The rules were required as part of two new state laws (HB 2017 and HB 2357) that mandate identification for titling a vehicle and first-time registrants. This change does not apply to registration renewals.

The identification requirements are a twophase process designed to give Texans, tax assessor-collectorsandbusinesses an opportunity to become educated on the new procedure. Beginning Sept. 3, 2012, vehicle buyers can show any government photo identification if it includes a current photo, unique identification number, birth date and expiration date.

On Sept. 1, 2013 and thereafter, the only acceptable government photo identification will be:

- State driver's license or identification certification issued by one of the U.S. states or territories;
 - United States or foreign passport;
 - United States military identification;

- North Atlantic Treaty Organization Smiths we might have recorded among the (NATO) identification: millions of title records, but by tying John
- United States Department of Homeland Security identification-issued document;
- Identification issued under a U.S. Status of Forces Agreement; or
- United States Citizenship and Immigration Services documentation.

The new identification requirements are another step towards creating more electronic services for customers, and ensuring the integrity of the motor vehicle database.

Next year Texans can expect to see is the replacement of paper titles with electronic ones or "eTitles," that will take the burden off vehicle owners to keep track of their title and help to reduce title fraud. The eTitle system is expected to launch in fall 2013.

The TxDMV plans to further automate the motor vehicle database so vehicle owners can be found by name. Currently the system can only find an owner in the database by the vehicle identification or license plate number.

"As we build out our new automation system, we will be able to use your Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) driver's license number as the unique identifier to make sure we find all the vehicles in the TxDMV motor vehicle database that are under your name," said Randy Elliston, TxDMV Vehicle Titles and Registration Division director. "For instance, you can imagine how many John

Smiths we might have recorded among the millions of title records, but by tying John Smith's name to his driver's license number we can find the right one."

Eventually this will allow vehicle owners to access their own information in the motor vehicle database. "We want to deliver to Texans a customer-centric system that is both useful and secure," said TxDMV Executive Director Whitney Brewster.

The agency is in the process of securing a vendor to retool its Registration and Titling System so it can support additional online services for customers and streamline business processes.

The TxDMV continues to offer registration renewal, email registration renewal reminders, specialty plate ordering, customer address changes, vehicle transfer notifications and vehicle transfer permits online. Consumers can also check whether a moving company is licensed and any complaints filed with the TxDMV against moving, bus or truck companies on the TxDMV website, www. TxDMV.gov.

"The TxDMV is dedicated to improving customer service and convenience for citizens," said TxDMV Board Chairman Victor Vandergriff. "Our employees and board members are focused on our mission to promote and protect the interests of the motoring public and citizens in the state of Texas."

If you're signed up for Veterans (VRAP) and are expecting to hear about approval and payments, call from a 202 area code.

There's word of a scam going around to steal money from VRAP recipients. As posted on the Department of Veterans Affairs page, it works like this:

and congratulate you on being approved for the program. You'll be told you can have your money within minutes... if you give your bank deposit information and agree to a \$205 service fee.

Whomever it is, that person isn't affiliated with the VA. The scammer takes your money. Nobody at the VA will ever call you like that and ask for your banking information. If you get a similar scam call, phone the Federal Trade Commission at 1-877-382-4357.

FSA helps fund agricultural youth projects

EL PASO COUNTY - The Farm Service Agency (FSA) makes loans to individual rural youths to establish projects of modest size in connection with their participation in 4-H clubs, Future Farmers of America (FFA), and similar organizations.

organized and supervised program of work. The project must be planned and operated with the produce sufficient income to repay the loan, and provide the youth with practical business and educational experience.

Each year, many young entrepreneurs take advantage of these loans and gain valuable business experience in the process.

To qualify for a loan, an applicant

- Be a citizen of the United
- Be between 10 and 20 years old;
- · Conduct a modest incomeproducing project in a supervised program of work, as outlined

Applicants must also be capable of

planning, managing, and operating the loan. In some cases, a cosigner the project under guidance and assistance from a project adviser. normally consists of crops produced The project adviser must recommend the project and the loan, and agree to provide adequate supervision.

These loans may be used to finance and operate income-producing nearly any kind of agricultural income-producing project. maximum amount for FSA youth loans is \$5,000.








people find out after submitting a return that their employer had sent an incorrect W-2 form, or they forgot to report self-employment income, or they incorrectly claimed someone as a dependent.

Although it's tempting to let such mistakes slide, chances are the IRS will discover the error eventually, and when they do you could be liable for interest and penalties going back to the due date of the original tax return. Worst case: You could even face criminal charges for filing a fraudulent return.

Here's a guide to when - and how you should file an amended tax return:

If you discover an error on your federal income tax return after having already e-filed or mailed it, you may file an amended return using IRS Form 1040X (at www.irs. gov). The following rules apply:

- Amended returns cannot be e-filed; you must submit a paper version.
- Submit a separate Form 1040X for each year's return you wish to amend and mail them in separate envelopes.
- Generally, you must file Form 1040X within three years from the date you filed your original return or within two years from the date you paid the tax, whichever is later.
- If your amended return involves changes to another schedule or form, you must attach a revised version of that schedule or form.
- If you're filing to claim an additional tax refund on a recently filed return, wait until you've financial education programs.

filed a couple of amended tax returns received the original refund before filing Form 1040X. You're allowed to cash the original check while waiting for any additional refund.

- On the other hand, if your amended return will result in you owing additional tax, file it right away to limit interest and penalty charges that might accrue.
- The normal processing time for a Form 1040X is eight to 12 weeks.

You needn't file an amended return because of simple math errors - the IRS will automatically make corrections and bill you for any additional tax required (or increase your refund). Nor must you file a 1040X if you forgot to attached tax forms or schedules to your return. The IRS will send a request if it needs them.

However, you should file an amended return if you:

- Received additional or amended tax forms or statements from employers, banks or investment brokers after you filed your return (e.g., W-2 or 1099 forms).
 - Forgot to report income.
- · Overlooked tax deductions or credits you could have claimed.
- · Claimed deductions or credits for which you weren't eligible.
- Didn't claim a dependent you were entitled to, or claimed someone you shouldn't have.
 - Chose the wrong filing status.

One last tip: If you're going to the trouble of filing an amended tax return for a specific reason, review the entire original return carefully for any other deductions, credits or exemptions you might have missed the first time.



Your good health By Paul G. Donahue, M.D.

DEAR DR. DONOHUE: I am a diabetic male, age 96, with many aches and pains but no high blood pressure. I have low cholesterol and am in control of my diabetes. In the past few weeks, I've noticed swelling of my ankles and feet. I have been taking two water pills a day for it. I never use salt or eat salty foods. What can you suggest for me? - S.S.

has many causes. One is sitting for long periods with the legs dangling down. With the legs in that position, gravity pulls fluid from the legs' blood vessels. Treatment for this kind of edema consists in elevating the legs. Every hour, lie down for 10 minutes with pillows under your legs and feet so that they are above heart level. When sitting, squeeze the leg muscles over and over. Muscle contractions stop the oozing of fluids from the blood vessels. And take a makes melatonin, a hormonemorning and afternoon walk. Elastic hose can keep fluid in blood vessels and out of the surrounding tissues.

Dilated leg veins - varicose veins – promote edema. A clot in a leg vein is another cause. That's usually quite painful, and you'd be aware that something is going on if you had a clot. Liver ailments can lead to edema. The liver makes a blood protein, albumin, that keeps fluid in circulation. With a low production of this protein, fluid leaks out of vessels. Kidney failure is another reason why edema occurs. Medicines can lead to it. The popular nonsteroidal Dr. Donohue regrets that he is anti-inflammatory pills.

Try the things I mentioned. See if they bring down the swelling. If they don't, you'll have to consult vour doctor.

A much more important cause of ankle-foot edema is heart failure, something that your doctor must check you for.



Medicare prescription coverage?

A: Anyone who has Medicare can get Medicare Part D prescription drug coverage. Joining a Medicare prescription drug plan is voluntary, and you pay an additional monthly premium for the coverage. People with higher incomes might pay a higher premium. If you have limited income and resources, you may be eligible for Extra Help to pay for the costs-monthly premiums, annual deductibles, and prescription copayments-related to a Medicare prescription drug plan. To qualify for Extra Help, you must reside in one of the 50 states or the District of Columbia. Your resources must be limited to \$13,070 for an individual or \$26,120 for a married couple living together. (Resources include such things as bank accounts, stocks, and bonds. 




