Clint ISD budget

Clint ISD Board of Trustees, at their regular board meeting held August 29, 2012, set the tax rate and adopted a budget for the 2012-2013 school year. Once again, taxpayers will not see an increase to the tax rate for this school year. The tax rate for the year will remain at \$1.335050 per \$100.00 of taxable property value. The average net taxable value, for a single family dwelling, in the District is currently \$89,682.00, which is an increase from the previous year. A balanced budget of \$84.4 million was adopted for the new school year. The budget was prepared based on a number of factors including an approved tax rate of \$1.335050, projected student enrollment, and expected attendance rates.

Tom Lea Month activities highlight Benito Juarez

EL PASO COUNTY – The El Paso Museum of History in collaboration with the Tom Lea Institute will host the Tom Lea Month Lecture Series: Benito Juárez at the Pass of the North (1865-1866), at 5:30 p.m., Thursday, October 4, at the museum (510 N. Santa Fe). The presentation is free and open to the public.

The public is invited to join the museum and the institute for an October celebration of El Paso's most famous artist and writer, Tom Lea. Throughout the month there will be a series of lectures and openings.

The Thursday event, which is the first of the series, will feature Nick Hauser, who will present an illustrated talk on Benito Juárez at the Pass of the North (1865-1866).

According to Houser, Tom Lea reserved the pleasure of portraiture for himself, choosing his own subjects to sit for him. He made an exception to paint a portrait of Benito Juárez for Blair House in Washington, D.C., commissioned by the Pan American Round Table of El Paso. when Napoleon II invaded Mexico and – on August 14, 1865 – arriving at Paso del Norte, which was Mexico's capital for 10 months. Houser will share the story of Mexico's greatest president for whom Ciudad Iuárez

president of Mexico in 1858, fleeing north

greatest president, for whom Ciudad Juárez was named in 1888. This history will be commemorated with the casting of Benito Juárez, the fourth of the 12 Travelers monuments by Houser's brother and nephew, sculptor John Sherrill Houser and Ethan Taliesin Houser.

Nick Houser has degrees in anthropology (M.A.), history (B.A.) and public health (M.PH.). As historian/archivist for Ysleta del Sur Pueblo, he has conducted historical research for the Tigua Indians and on the history of the El Paso region. He has created exhibits for museums and cultural centers, including the Tigua Indian Cultural Center, El Paso Mission Trail Association, the Los Portales Visitor Center in San Elizario, and XII Travelers Memorial of the Southwest.

Nick Houser has published books and

Canutillo ISD invites dropouts back to school

CANUTILLO – Dropouts from the Canutillo Independent School District got some surprise visitors at their front door on Saturday, September 15.

More than thirty CISD educators, along with local dignitaries like state Representative Dee Margo, Judge Brian Haggerty, Vinton Mayor Madeleine Praino and El Paso Community College President Dr. William Serrata participated in the Dropout Recovery Saturday event, which already has resulted in the re-enrollment of 11 students at Canutillo High School.

The event, in which participants personally knock on the front doors of selected dropouts to encourage them to re-enroll in school and earn a high-school diploma, is now in its third year in Canutillo.



How to stem the tide of junk mail

Here's more than you ever wanted to know about junk mail: Each year, direct mail creates 10 billion pounds of solid waste in the U.S. and costs local communities more than \$1 billion in collection and disposal expenses – not to mention putting you at greater risk for identity theft if you don't shred personalized mailings before tossing.

So how can you stop the flood of junk mail you receive? You could try moving or changing your name, but as you've probably noticed, a lot of what's delivered to your mailbox is addressed to "Occupant." In fact, the U.S. Postal Service relies heavily on such deliveries, which now outnumber first-class postage mailings.

Here are a few more practical suggestions for stemming the tide:

A good way to significantly reduce the number of offers you get for new credit accounts and insurance is to register with www.OptOutPrescreen.com, a secure website created by the leading credit bureaus (Equifax, Experian, Innovis and TransUnion).

By completing a simple online form, you can request to be removed from marketing lists the bureaus supply to lenders and insurance companies for use in firm (preapproved) credit or insurance offers. The electronic opt-out is valid for five years. If you want to opt out permanently, you must mail the form to the address provided. You can also opt back into such mailings electronically through the website. And, if you prefer, you may opt in or out by phone at (888) 567-8688.

Another good method to curb the amount of direct mail you receive is to register with www.DMAchoice.org, a program run by the Direct Marketing Association, the leading trade organization for businesses and nonprofits that send direct mail. When you register, your name is put in a "delete" file that is sent to DMA's 3,600-plus members to check against their mailing lists.

It's important to note that not all marketers belong to DMA, so registering won't stop all such mailings. Also, it won't stop mailings from companies you already do business with or to which you've made a donation in the past. To get off their lists you'll have to contact them directly.


You can also register with DMAchoice. org to stop mail from being sent to a deceased individual or if you want to manage mail being sent to a dependent in your care. And, they have an email preference service where you can opt out of receiving unsolicited commercial emails from DMA members for six years.

A third opt-out option to explore is www. CatalogChoice.org, a free service that helps you submit opt-out requests for catalogs, coupons, credit card offers, phonebooks, circulars and more. Catalog Choice also offers several paid where they do more of the legwork to get you off third-party mailing databases.

One last suggestion: If you've got elderly parents, you might want to screen their mail for an overabundance of direct mail – especially catalogs and solicitations for money. If they're on a fixed income and susceptible to strong sales pitches, the combination can be devastating to their bank account. You can help them register with the organizations mentioned above.

No matter how diligent your efforts to get yourself off unwanted mailing lists, you're probably still going to get some junk mail. But it's good to know there are ways to significantly scale back the amount.



essential tremor see a person with it, they immediately assume that the person is quite nervous. The shaky hands are a giveaway. It's not "nerves" that are causing the shakiness; it's essential tremor. A glitch in one of the brain's movement-control centers has occurred. Katharine Hepburn suffered from essential tremor. Not only did her hands shake, but so did her head and her voice.

Essential tremor is a common condition. Its other name is familial tremor, indicating that it runs in families. Most affected people can find other relatives who have it.

Trembling hands make it near impossible to bring a spoonful of soup to the mouth. Handwriting often degenerates into a scrawl. Buttoning a shirt or coat becomes a herculean task.

Alcohol abolishes the tremor for a short time. Alcohol can't be used as a treatment. Other medicines, like propranolol(Inderal)and primidone (Mysoline), offer effective control. For seriously disabling tremors, deep-brain stimulation can put an end to them.

People can help control shaking hands by holding their elbows firmly against the body when using their hands for a fine task.

> Pinworms are an extremely common infection, especially in children. During the night, the female pinworm crawls out of the rectum to lay eggs on the nearby skin. She is tiny, 0.4 inches (1 cm) long. You must have good eyes to see these worms. A magnifying glass is a big help. Pinworms rarely make their way to other organs. Some speculate that they might be a cause of appendicitis.

> Eggs on the skin cause intense itching. Your doctor is best equipped to make the diagnosis. Doctors have the instruments to clearly see the worm or its eggs. Mebendazole (Vermox), albendazole (Albenza) and pyrantel pamoate (Pin-X) have a good track record of getting rid of pinworms. They are not found in fish.

> Undercooked freshwater fish can harbor the fish tapeworm. which grows to a length of 39 feet. It produces few, if any, symptoms. Prolonged infection with it can lead to vitamin B-12 deficiency. For diagnosis, a stool specimen should be sent to a lab experienced in identifying the eggs and the worm segments. Praziquantel (Biltricide) is the treatment.




