# Clint officials consider annexation requests

CLINT - Town of Clint officials are contemplating annexing about 82 acres of land including John and Staci Witte's one acre plot, Waynelle and James Strachan's 11-acre farm, and Tropicana Development's nearly 62-acre subdivision.

The three landowners submitted individual requests in November to have their property voluntarily annexed by the Town of Clint. A series of public hearings were originally scheduled to be held in February for the purpose of receiving public comments concerning the requests but were cancelled recently.

The Town of Clint cancelled the public hearings on the proposed initiation of annexation proceedings to allow for revisions in certain property descriptions, according to household, which is the Strachan's home. the town's legal counsel.

State law requires that municipalities hold at least two public meetings before deliberating on any annexation issues.

"We needed to revise the description of the property to be annexed to better describe the portion of Herring Road that is included in the annexation and have that new description be included in the notice that is published. Just a clerical correction, but we have to now postpone the hearings to get it done," stated Town of Clint Attorney Elaine S. Hengen, of the Bojorquez Law Firm.

According to Clint Mayor Dale Reinhardt, the proposed annexation is a unique case because the landowners are voluntarily requesting annexation and all of the property in consideration is currently agricultural land - there are no residents except for one

However, a local homebuilder said that plans are underway to build a neighborhood with affordable homes and apartments on one of the parcels of land being considered for annexation by Clint's town council.

Bobby Bowling IV, president of Tropicana Homes, said that plans are to build about 250 single-family homes and a 76-unit apartment complex on their land that is located between the recently completed Clint High School and the new U.S. Customs and Border Patrol Station along Highway 20.

Bowling said that the homes will probably be priced at about \$125,000 and the apartments will rent for around \$550. The Lower Valley Water District will provide the water and sewer services to the

# Avoiding tax refund identity fraud

Many people file their income tax to submit withholding and income returns as early in the year as possible. Some are eager to claim their tax refund right away, while others are simply following their New Year's midnight, April 15.

Let me add another good reason forms) isn't required. to file your taxes right away: tax refund identity fraud.

Social Security number (SSN), birth date and other private information to file a fraudulent income tax return in your name and then pockets the resulting tax refund. Often, a victim's first clue is a letter from the IRS contesting their legitimate tax return, saying one has already been processed under that name. It can take months - and mounds of paperwork – to unravel the mess.

This scam has proliferated in address. recent years thanks to a confluence of events:

- There's a thriving black market in personal information stolen from healthcare facilities, nursing homes, schools, insurance companies and other institutions that require an SSN as identification.

  - Many people receive refunds via direct deposit and prepaid debit That's where someone uses your cards. Criminals open and close accounts using bogus addresses long before the theft has been detected.

Thanks to severe budget cuts and chronic understaffing – not to mention constantly playing whacka-mole with thieves who dream up new schemes - the IRS is hardpressed to keep up. In one extreme example, the agency issued more than \$3.3 million in refunds for 2,137 tax returns filed to a single

But all is not lost. The IRS has significantly beefed up its fraudprevention efforts. In 2011, they interceptednearly 262,000 fraudulent tax returns seeking almost \$1.5 billion in refunds related to identity theft. And they now issue special personal identification numbers (PINs) to impacted taxpayers to protect their future tax filings.

So what should you do if you've January, even though employers and been victimized? Typically, the IRS

- More than one tax return for you was filed:
- You have a balance due, refund offset or have had collection actions taken against you for a year in which you didn't file a return; or
- IRS records indicate you received wages from an employer you don't recognize. This could indicate that someone has used your personal information to get a job.

If you receive such a notice, don't ignore it. Complete an Identity Theft Affidavit (IRS Form 14039 at www. irs.gov) and return it with a copy of the notice to the address provided on the notice. If you did not receive a notice but believe you may be at risk, the form contains separate submission instructions.

The IRS's Identity Theft Protection website (www.irs.gov/uac/Identity-Protection) includes tons of helpful information, including ways to tell whether your identity may have been stolen, how to report a breach and tips to avoid identity theft.

And finally, file your tax return as early as possible to beat potential scammers to the punch. If you owe money, you can always file your return now and mail the payment by the April 15 deadline.





# Get flu shot before you get sick

TEXAS – Flu season is picking up steam across Texas. Widespread influenza has reached epidemic levels in the state, killing six children so far this flu season, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Texas physicians urge people six months and older to get the flu vaccine if they haven't already, and to take precautions to stop the spread of this deadly disease.

"This year is much worse than last year," said Jason Terk, MD, a Keller pediatrician and chair of the Texas Medical Association (TMA) Council on Science and Public Health.

"This year the flu arrived early and sickened more people than past years," he added. "The predominant flu type this year is called H3N2, and people seem not to have as good immunity from this type as from other flu strains."

this predominates are usually bad flu seasons," said Terk.

However, it's not too late to get vaccinated and protect yourself and your loved ones from this potentially deadly disease, he said. "The flu vaccine is the best way to reduce your chances of getting sick from any one of the flu viruses that circulate every year. It also helps the people who live and work around you because getting vaccinated boosts community immunity." (When more people are vaccinated, fewer people get sick and spread the bug to those who are not vaccinated.)

Physicians say the flu shot is just as effective whether you got it in October or you get it now in January, though it takes about two weeks for vaccine to help someone develop resistance to the flu. One shot protects an individual for the entire flu season, which runs from October through May.

"Everyone who is 6 months of age or older should get a vaccination against the flu every year," said

strain Terk. "Children, especially those under the age of 2 years, as well as the elderly, pregnant women, and those with underlying health conditions are at increased risk for complications from flu - so much so, they could die." That additional vulnerability to the flu is why physicians characterize these as high-risk groups.

For those who develop mild flulike symptoms, physicians say stay home to prevent spreading the illness to others, and drink plenty of fluids. Contact your doctor if you have severe symptoms or if you are sick and are in one of the high-risk groups. There are medications to treat the flu, and the CDC recommends the use of antiviral medications to treat influenza, starting as early as possible after becoming sick.

But doctors urge Texans to take precautions to avoid getting sick in the first place: Cover your mouth with a tissue or your elbow when you sneeze; wash your hands often; stay away from people who are sick; and avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth. But the flu shot might be the best defense.

"Protect your family, yourself, and those around you. Get a flu vaccination. It is safe and effective," said Terk.

# AARP poll shows support for capping payday loan rates, fees

TEXAS - A statewide poll released today shows that nearly two-thirds (63 percent) of surveyed Texans age 45 and older support a state law that would cap the interest rates and fees these businesses can charge borrowers. The majority of those surveyed (79%) believe that these loans should be capped at 36% or less.

AARP is urging the Texas legislature to clamp down on the predatory practices of payday and auto title lenders. These lenders regularly charge annual percentage rates (APRs) of 500 percent or more--draining wealth from Texas families and often pushing them further into debt and financial hardship. The poll was commissioned by AARP Texas and has a 4.4% margin of error.

These poll results suggest we have Texans' support.

"Clearly Texans think that putting a stop to the high interest and fees that trap Texans in a

never-ending cycle of mounting debt is long overdue," said Joe Sanchez, Associate State Director of AARP Texas. "It's time to give borrowers a fighting chance to repay these loans."

The poll clearly indicates that Texans are looking to their elected officials for answers. The vast majority (75%) of Texans surveyed strongly agree that government leaders in Texas should work to lower the interest rates and fees of payday and auto title loans in the state.

In 2011, the Texas Legislature took an initial step towards meaningful reform for the first time in a decade. House Bills 2592 and 2594 established basic licensing, reporting and regulation. But they fell short in addressing the cycle of debt these loans create.

For many cities and counties across Texas, this just wasn't enough. Austin, Dallas, El Paso and San Antonio have taken measures into their own hands by enacting ordinances to rein in payday lending and protect their residents.





proposed annexation property.

Clint is a large farming community about 19 miles east of El Paso and part of the El Paso Metropolitan Statistical Area. The town was incorporated in 1974 and encompasses a total area of approximately two square miles, and the 2010 census reported a population of 926 inhabitants.

According to Bowling, the annexation of the imminent Tropicana housing development is a win-win situation for both the Town of Clint and his company. "We've been negotiating with town officials for nearly a year, and we were able to come to mutual agreements."

Bowling said that the new housing development would add property taxes, as well as annexation fees on every lot, to the town's coffers. In addition, the builders will use third party state-licensed inspectors to ensure compliance with state and county building codes, thereby relieving Clint of the inspection process burden. And, Tropicana will incorporate park with ponding areas and two commercial property sites as part of the new neighborhood.

In return, the town will provide police services and park and street maintenance to the new community, according to Hengen. She added that town officials are still in the process of developing a service plan document to identify issues that will need to be addressed if the annexation proposal is approved.

The public hearings on the proposed voluntary annexation requests by the three landowners will probably be re-scheduled for March, stated the town's attorney.

In all of these cases, the suspects used different items to fish out envelopes containing checks for rent from drop-boxes. The suspects, after obtaining the checks and money orders, would alter the "pay-to" line to different false names and cash them at various locations. As a result more than \$40,000 has been taken by altering the checks and money orders. Several of the thefts are believed to have occurred during weekends and during night-time hours. Investigators believe residents may have seen the suspects and are asking for help from the public to find the perpetrators. 



# Your good health By Paul G. Donahue, M.D.

DEAR DR. DONOHUE: Two years ago I had shingles, and I now suffer the aftereffects of it. The sores went away in a month, but the stinging, burning, throbbing pain is still with me. I cannot wear clothing over the affected shoulder. No medicines have eased the pain so far. Is there any help? -M.L.

You now are dealing with for delivery. postherpetic neuralgia, pain that lingers long after the shingles rash has gone. The virus that causes shingles is the same virus that causes chickenpox. Almost every adult on this continent harbors that lives on in nerve cells.

From time to time, at older ages, it wakens from its hibernation, travels down the nerve to the skin and causes an outbreak of blisters on a red base. The outbreak goes away in about three weeks. Pain can linger for a long time - months, to years. In traveling down the amount of skim milk has 300 mg. nerve, the virus damaged it.

postherpetic neuralgia medicines. Two are antidepressants nortriptyline and amitriptyline given not for depression but for pain relief. Cymbalta (duloxetine) is another antidepressant that can lessen postherpetic pain. Lyrica (pregabalin) is an anti-seizure medicine that's approved for this problem. Neurontin (gabapentin) is another seizure medicine used for control of the lingering pain of shingles.

Capsaicin lotion, cream or gel (Zostrix, Capsin, R-Gel) is applied directly to the involved skin. A higher concentration of capsaicin comes as a patch that's applied in the doctor's office, left on for an hour and then removed. three months. It's called Qutenza. Another skin patch is the Lidoderm patch. The latest medicine is requires fewer doses.







# Social Security Q&A By Ray Vigil

Q: I applied for a Social Security card for my baby at the hospital, but the card came back with a misspelled name. What should I do?

A: Find at least two original documents proving your child's U.S. citizenship and identity, as well as one proof of your identity as the parent. Then go to your local Social Security office or card center to ask for a corrected card. The documents you show us must be either originals or copies certified by the issuing agency. We cannot accept photocopies or notarized copies of documents. To find out more, visit www.socialsecurity.gov/ssnumber.

Q: My aunt is considering applying for Extra Help with Medicare Part D prescription drug costs, but she has about \$10,000 in the bank. Would she still be eligible with this much money?

You then will earn delayed retirement credits up to age 70, as long as you do not collect benefits on your own work record. Later, when you do begin receiving benefits on your own record, those payments could very well be higher than they would have been otherwise, because you earned delayed retirement credits.
