#### Tires collected

On Saturday June 8, 2013 the Village of Vinton hosted a Tire Recycling Drop Off day for the area residents. The event was hosted by Keep Vinton Beautiful and sponsored by Bridgestone's One Team One Planet program. This program focuses on three objectives: to be in harmony with nature, to value natural resources, and to reduce our CO2 and other significant emissions. Bridgestone's main focus is to maintain a healthy environment for today's world and for future generations. Bridgestone provided the trailer in which the tires were loaded onto and also proper disposal of the used tires at no cost to the village. The purpose of this event was not only to reduce the number of used tires in the community, but also to diminish the risk and amount of mosquitoes for the coming summer months. The event began at 8 a.m., as local residents and volunteers participated by bringing in used tires from their homes and by collecting illegally dumped tires from the side of roads. A total of 1,052 tires were collected throughout the day. There were 15 volunteers and over 40 area residents, which included individuals from Vinton, Anthony, Canutillo, Westway, and El Paso, who came out and dropped off tires. The Village of Vinton would like to thank the volunteers from ArcelorMittal for collecting 408 tires.

#### Flag display

El Paso Museum of History announced recently that it was given a 45 star American flag which flew over the United States Consulate in Juarez in 1907. In observance of the upcoming Fourth of July celebration, the flag- along with a copy of the Declaration of Independence- is currently on display through July 7, at the entrance of the museum's Transportation Gallery. The exhibit is free and open to the public. El Paso Museum of History is located at 510 N. Santa Fe Street. The 45th star on the nation's flag was added on July 4th, 1896, in honor of the State of Utah. It was replaced by the 46-star flag on July 4th, 1908, after Oklahoma was admitted to the Union. A 45-star flag would have flown over El Paso's first City Hall, built in 1899, and would have been used during President McKinley's visit to El Paso in 1901.

# Rio Grande offers afternoon of recreational fun

Enthusiastic, fun-seeking desert dwellers gathered at the Rio Grande recently to take advantage of the cooling waters' relief from the 100-plus heat that has been pervading the region this summer.

About fifty raft entries and more than 200 participants took part in the great river raft race held recently along a stretch of the Rio Grande between the Vinton and Canutillo bridges in El Paso's Upper Valley.

The race is in its third year back after a 28year hiatus. This year's event was organized by radio station KLAQ 95.5 FM and was sponsored by the Viva Auto Group.

The race, which first started in 1979, ended after 1983 because of levee repairs and river regulations. It was resurrected in 2011 with approval from the El Paso County Sheriff's Office and the El Paso County Irrigation Water District, KLAQ General Manager Brad Dubow said.

# Vinton could qualify for state water funds if it applies

The issue of water and sewer will be a top agenda item once again for the Village of Vinton's July 2nd council meeting. Up for discussion will be Vinton's selection to receive Disadvantaged Community Funds from the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB).

Vinton ranks 10th in Texas for funds eligibility through the Clean Water Program; these funds would be used to construct a city-wide sewer system, according to Cesar A. Vasquez, Village of Vinton community outreach intern. And, the village ranks 22nd in

capacity for the entire town, he stated.

"Both programs are funded as 'First Come- First Serve' for the disadvantaged funds which provide a guaranteed grant of 70 percent of the project amount," Vasquez explained. "Under the Clean Water Program, Vinton would be eligible for approximately \$14 million in state grant funds. The Drinking Water Program would provide approximately \$11 million in state grant funds," he stated.

"The balance of funding could come from a number of other funding agencies such as the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) or Border Environment Cooperation Commission (BECC), who in the past the state for funds through the Drinking Water awarded Vinton additional funding for one

Program, which would help increase the water or both of the programs, if the Vinton City Council should decide collectively to apply for the TWDB and other agency funding," Vasquez said.

Vinton Mayor Madeleine Praino stated, "It is morally imperative that the Vinton city council ensures that each person in the village has access to safe and sustainable drinking water. Water is not an issue of luxury; it is a matter of equity and inclusion to create a community in which the well-being of everyone is protected at a fundamental level. As the Mayor of Vinton, I will continue to work toward this goal."

The Texas Water Development Board will begin taking applications September 2nd for both programs. For more information, call the Village of Vinton at 886-5104.

# Disputing credit card charges

Billing Act (FCBA) protects your rights during such credit card billing disputes. It also outlines the process for contesting charges made to your account. Here's how it works:

Billing errors that are covered by the FCBA include:

- Fraudulent or unauthorized use of your credit card, whether it was stolen or merchants charged unapproved items to your account.
- Charges that list the wrong date or amount.
- Charges for goods or services you either did not accept or that weren't delivered as agreed.
- · Math errors, such as being charged twice for a transaction.
- Failure to post payments or other

According to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), you may withhold payment of the disputed amount and related charges during the investigation. In fact, many card issuers may voluntarily remove the charge until the matter is resolved since they are representing you, their client, in the dispute.

## **Museum shines** spotlight on local history presentations

El Paso Museum of History will feature two fascinating presentations in June – one on ghost hunting in the Southwest and the other about the Socorro Mission's past, present, and future. The special presentations are part of the museum's on-going Spotlight on History program.

Chris Medina, founder of Ghost Hunters of the Southwest, will present an illustrated lecture on The History of Ghost Hunting, at 6:30 p.m., Thursday, June 27.

According to Medina, ghost hunting has become the new national past time. "Fueled by popular television shows on the History Channel and PBS, everyone has become enthralled by what paranormal activity may reside in their town or residence," he stated.

"What is the true nature of 'ghost' hunting? Ghost stories have been haunting humankind since the beginning of time. They have been used to educate and inform children as they sat around campfires and kitchen tables. Ghost stories are parables warning against certain behaviors and they pass on cultural traits," Medina explained.

Medina said that he has been performing investigations of local historic sites such as Southwest General Hospital, the Plaza Theater, ASARCO, and the El Paso County Courthouse. He added that he prides himself on the fact that all of the investigations begin with thorough research of existing archival material to ensure factual data.

The second featured presentation is part of the museum's The Missions and Their People Lecture Series, which complements its

- Sam as a fictional character, but he's actually based in fact. The original Uncle Sam was one Samuel Wilson, born in Massachusetts in 1766. When he was 14 years old, he joined the army to fight in the American Revolution. Once the war was over, he moved to Troy, N.Y., started working in the meat-packing industry, and became known locally as "Uncle Sam" due to his jovial manner and ethical business practices.
