ESD board of directors serve on a voluntary basis and are responsible for budgeting and financing interests and investment of the district. County Commissioners seek applicants for Emergency Services District board of directors

EL PASO COUNTY - Officials with El Paso County's Emergency Services Districts (ESD) said that the composition of the county's two emergency districts, which oversee fire protection and first-responder medical services, is being restructured so its board members are better qualified, have no conflicts of interest and serve staggered terms.

Commissioners Court is accepting applications through February 14 to fill two seats in ESD No. 1 and one in ESD No. 2. Members of the ESD boards are volunteers responsible for budgeting, financing interests and investment of the district. The districts are government entities that oversee the volunteer fire departments and the emergency medical services for the unincorporated areas of the county. ESDs, governed by the Texas Health and Safety Code, collect taxes from property owners in the county to run the services. County commissioners set the ESDs' tax rate of 10 cents per \$100 property valuation - the maximum allowed under state law. ESD No. 1 contracts with the Horizon City Fire Department to provide services to that city and the 150-square-mile area surrounding it. The department has about 40 volunteers who respond to about 1,800 calls a year. The ESD runs on a budget of about \$1 million a year.

ESD No. 2 encompasses the areas around Vinton, Canutillo, Socorro, Clint, San Elizario, Fabens and Montana Vista. It oversees 11 volunteer fire departments and more than 220 volunteers who respond to about 2,800 calls a year. About 75 percent of the calls are for medical problems, officials said. The district's annual revenues are about \$5 million, and expenses are about \$4.5 million.

Individuals interested in applying to serve on the board of directors must be at least 18 years of age, a resident citizen of the state, and a qualified voter within areas served by the district or owner of land subject to taxation in the district.

According to county officials, applicants must have the time to serve during the term of appointment, have the desire and commitment to become involved, have a basic knowledge of business practices and/or fiscal issues, and

Clint ISD seeks input from parents, teachers on boundary re-alignment

HORIZON CITY - Clint Independent School District (CISD) is holding a series of meetings to discuss possible realignment of attendance zones for students enrolled at schools in the Horizon City area.

CISD officials stated recently that the school board is considering redrawing attendance boundaries for Carroll T. Welch Intermediate School and Frank Macias and Desert Hills elementary schools to address their growing student populations.

The meetings will be held at 5:30 p.m., Tuesday, Jan. 13 at Carroll T. Welch Intermediate School (14510 McMahon Drive) and Wednesday, Jan. 14 at Frank Macias Elementary School (14400 Golden Eagle Drive). The first of the three meetings was held Jan. 7 at Desert Hills Elementary School.

This school year, Carrol T. Welch Intermediate School serves students who are enrolled in the fourth and fifth grades. Frank Macias and Desert Hills elementary schools serve students enrolled in grades pre-kinder through third.

In order to serve the growing needs of these campuses, district officials are considering not only redrawing the attendance zones for the schools but also adding extra grade levels to

VA links 5 more illnesses to TBI

The Department of Veterans deficiency from hypothalamo-Affairs has added five illnesses pituitary changes if they manifest to service-connected Traumatic within 12 months of moderate or Brain Injury (TBI). What this means is that veterans who have those illnesses as well as TBI will have an easier time getting additional disability benefits.

The VA based its decision on a report by the National Academy of Sciences Institute of Medicine that found "sufficient evidence" to link moderate to severe TBI with the five conditions: Parkinson's disease, certain types of dementia, depression, unprovoked seizures or certain diseases of the hypothalamus and pituitary glands. Those secondary illnesses will be considered service-connected and won't require medical opinions to establish whether there is correlation to TBI.

There's a time period for three of the five illnesses, however. Parkinson's disease or unprovoked DOD programs for brain injury, seizures don't have a time frame.

• Dementia, if it manifests within 15 years with moderate or *Freddy Groves regrets* severe TBI.

• Depression, if it manifests reader questions, but or severe TBI or within 12 months with mild TBI.

 Diseases of severe TBI.

Even if you don't meet the guidelines for severity of TBI or length of time between TBI and the onset of the second illness, file your claim anyway, says the VA.

If you have questions or want to file a new claim, go online to www.eBenefits.va.gov/ebenefits or call toll free to 1-800-827-1000. If you're still active duty but within 180 days of discharge, you can file a pre-discharge TBI claim at the same link to phone number.

Retirement plan limits largely unchanged in 2014

Anyone who's bought groceries, filled their gas probably be surprised to learn that, according to Department of Labor's Consumer Price Index for Urban Consumers (CPI-U), the rate of inflation is 2012 to September 2013.

That's bad news for people who were hoping to boost their contributions to an IRA, 401(k) plan or other tax-advantaged retirement savings accounts, since the IRS uses the CPI-U's September year-overyear performance to determine whether or not to make cost-of-living adjustments to many of the retirement contributions you and your employer can make in the following year.

Here are highlights of what will and won't change in 2014:

Defined contribution plans. The maximum allowable annual contribution you can make to a workplace 401(k), 403(b), 457(b) or federal Thrift Savings plan remains unchanged at \$17,500. Keep in mind these additional factors:

• People over 50 can also make an additional \$5,500 in catch-up contributions (unchanged from 2013).

• The annual limit for combined employee and employer contributions increased by \$1,000 to \$52,000.

· Because your plan may limit the percentage of pay you can contribute, your maximum contribution may actually be less. (For example, if the maximum you could only contribute \$6,000.)

Individual Retirement Accounts (IRAs). The maximum annual contribution to IRAs remains the same at \$5,500 (plus an additional \$1,000 if 50 or older – also unchanged from 2013). Maximum contributions to traditional IRAs are not impacted by personal income, but if your modified adjusted gross income (AGI) exceeds certain limits, the maximum amount you can contribute to a Roth IRA gradually phases out:

 For singles/heads of households the phase-out AGI tank or paid insurance premiums recently would range is \$114,000 to \$129,000 (increased from 2013's \$112,000 to \$127,000 range). Above \$129,000, you cannot contribute to a Roth.

• For married couples filing jointly, the range relatively flat - only 1.2 percent from September is \$181,000 to \$191,000 (up from \$178,000 to \$188,000).

> Keep in mind these rules for deducting traditional IRA contributions on your federal tax return:

> • If you're single, a head of household, a qualifying widow(er) or married and neither spouse is covered by an employer-provided retirement plan, you can deduct the full IRA contribution, regardless of income.

> • If you are covered by an employer plan and are single/head of household, the tax deduction phases out for AGI between \$60,000 and \$70,000 (up from \$59,000 to \$69,000 in 2013); if married and filing jointly, the phase-out range is \$96,000 to \$116,000 (up from \$95,000 to \$115,000).

> • If you're married and aren't covered by an employer plan but your spouse is, the IRA deduction is phased out if your combined AGI is between \$181,000 and \$191,000 (up from \$178,000 to \$188,000).

> For more details, read IRS Publication 590 at www. irs.gov.

Retirement Saver' Tax Credit. As an incentive to help low- and moderate-income workers save for retirement through an IRA or company-sponsored plan, many are eligible for a Retirement Savers' Tax Credit of up to \$1,000 (\$2,000 if filing jointly). This credit lowers your contribution is 10 percent of pay and you earn \$60,000, tax bill, dollar for dollar, in addition to any other tax deduction you already receive for your contribution.

> Qualifying income ceiling limits for the Savers' Tax Credit increased in 2014 to \$60,000 for joint filers, \$45,000 for heads of household, and \$30,000 for singles or married persons filing separately. Consult IRS Form 8880 for more information.

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El Paso County falls under eFileTexas program

State of Texas became the nation's largest state to implement a mandatory electronic court filing (e-filing) system aimed at digitizing court filings. Beginning today, civil cases filed in the state's 10 most populous counties (Bexar, Collin, Dallas, Denton, El Paso, Fort Bend, Harris, Hidalgo, Tarrant and Travis) and all case types in the Supreme Court, Court of Criminal Appeals and 14 appellate courts, must be filed electronically. Every six months, more counties will make the change from paper to digital until all courts throughout the state are e-filing for civil cases by 2016.

In 2014, Texas' e-filing system known as eFileTexas and available at www.efiletexas. gov is expected to handle more than 3.5 million electronic court filings - more than any other state system in the country.

The system works by accepting electronic documents from attorneys and other filers via Web portals and securely distributes these documents to the appropriate county or appellate court where they can be accepted into the case management system of that court.

"E-filing promotes the efficient and uniform administration of justice," said Texas Supreme Court Chief Justice, Nathan Hecht. "In the 21st century, we no longer can rely on an 18th or 19th century vision for our systems. I think historians will look back on this time period and see that e-filing revolutionized our courts for the better."

"A new year, brings a new vision for our courts," said David Slayton, Administrative Director of the Texas Office of Court Administration. "E-filing is a technology solution that will save taxpayer dollars
