Roofing scams

Stormy weather as the one El Paso is experiencing now can produce a big demand for roofing contractors. It is also a great breeding ground for "storm chasers," fly-by-night roofing contractors who sometimes go door-to-door offering their services enticing residents with incredibly low estimates or offering new roofs paid entirely by the insurance company. El Paso County Attorney Jo Anne Bernal has some recommendations for residents who are having problems with their roofs and are in need of hiring a contractor to fix their leaks:

- Hire only licensed or bonded contractors. They might be more expensive, but are the only ones who can offer you some peace of mind in case you are not happy with the repairs.
- Do not be rushed into signing any contract, especially if the contractor uses high-pressure sales tactics, such as todayonly discounts.
- · Always sign a detailed contract for the project, and get the terms and any warranties in writing.
- · Before deciding to hire a contractor, do your homework. Get more than one estimate; ask for references from the companies, and search online for any complaint filed against the company or the individual, particularly with the El Paso Better Business Bureau (http://www. bbb.org/elpaso/). You can also call the El Paso County Attorney's Office at (915) 546-2050 to find out about any pending or previous criminal cases involving a particular contractor.
- · Never make full payment of the project upfront. A reputable legitimate home improvement company will NEVER ask for full payment upfront. However there are times when it's industry standard for the homeowner to make a 50% deposit depending on the project, price and/or special order of the materials.
- · Check with the City of El Paso to

First, understand that the main reason you're being asked to cosign a loan is because lenders don't think the borrower is a good risk. By cosigning, you're guaranteeing that you'll repay the full loan - plus any late fees or collection costs - should the borrower default.

If that doesn't scare you sufficiently, read on:

- Even one late or missed payment can damage your credit.
- In most states, the creditor can – and probably will – go after you for repayment without first trying to collect from the borrower, because can help lessen your risk: they know you're more likely to have the money.
- If the loan goes into default or is charged off, that fact will go into your credit report and can take seven years to erase.
- If you pledged personal property to secure the loan, you could lose these items if the borrower defaults.

- Should the lender agree to settle for a lesser amount, you'll have to report the difference as "debt forgiveness income" and pay tax on
- If you cosign a credit card account, primary borrowers over age 21 are allowed to raise the credit limit without notifying you.
- Government-backed student loans generally aren't eligible for bankruptcy protection unless you can prove "undue hardship."
- Some private student loans contain a clause allowing the borrower to originate additional years' loans without your signed approval.
- Even if you're not asked to repay the loan, your potential liability could stop you from getting additional credit if your debt-toincome ratio is too high.

If you do decide to cosign someone's loan, taking these steps

- Calculate whether you can afford the loan's monthly payments, should the borrower stop paying. To be prudent, start setting aside enough money to cover it for one year, which will allow you to keep payments current while working out a solution.
 - Insist that the lender agree, in financial education programs

writing, to notify you if the borrower missed a payment or the loan's terms change. That'll give you more time to make contingency plans.

- If you're unsure about the borrower's reliability to pay each month on time, ask the lender to send payment requests directly to you so you can manage the transaction. (It's a pain, but one way to guarantee timely payments.)
- Ask the lender to stipulate in the contract that you're only responsible for the loan's principal amount, should it default. It doesn't hurt to
- Make sure you get copies of all paperwork in case of future disputes.
- Don't consolidate old loans accumulated by your spouse before you married. If something should happen (divorce, death), you would be responsible for paying them off.

Congressman Gallego was born in the West Texas town of Alpine where he attended local public schools and worked in his family's restaurant. He graduated from his hometown college, Sul Ross State University and earned a degree from The University of Texas School of Law. He became an assistant attorney general before returning home to serve as a felony prosecutor.

The challenger, a native of San Antonio who is trying to flip the district back to the Republicans, is a former Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) agent, who served as an operations officer for nine years. Since June 2010, Hurd has been a senior advisor with the cybersecurity firm FusionX. He graduated from Texas A&M University in College Station with a Bachelor of Science degree in Computer Science.

So the stage is set for November's election, when Lower Valley voters will be crucial in Texas' only competitive congressional contest.

Its outcome could predict the future of Texas politics.

District 23 includes precincts that are heavily Hispanic – a group that tends to vote for Democrats - in southwest San Antonio and in El Paso County. But it also includes heavily Republican precincts in the San Antonio suburbs and areas that lean Republican in rural West Texas.

The seat has changed between the parties in the last two elections and it was the only Texas congressional race in which both candidates received significant contributions by the end of the June 30 reporting period, according to a campaign finance watchdog website.

With the Texas population becoming increasingly black and Hispanic, Democrats are gearing up to turn Texas purple into a blue. If that happens, because of the state's size, it would have huge implications for national politics.

A University of Houston political scientist said in a recent report that the District 23 race is exactly the sort of contest Democrats have to win if they want to turn the state. He stated that District 23 is a microcosm of fairly conservative, but that it has many Hispanic voters who have not gone to the polls in the past.

According to a recent survey,

Gallego has an edge in the race. The incumbent has a larger campaign chest than Hurd and has television commercials running in the El Paso, San Antonio and Midland-Odessa markets. Hurd has not yet run any commercials. Also, voters in the small towns and ranch country there have a long acquaintance with Gallego.

On the other side, national Republicans are pinning their hopes on Hurd. Experts speculate that Republicans will try to pull off an upset by trying to repeat the wave of 2010 that put a Republican in the District 23 seat. They expect Republicans to use President Obama's unpopularity and concerns over illegal immigration to defeat Gallego, who is a strong advocate of immigration reform.

Also potentially aiding Hurd is the fact that Hispanics tend to vote in lesser numbers in off-year elections such as the one taking place this November. County records show that turnout in the heavily Hispanic precincts in District 23 was 15 to 20 percent less in the 2010 election than



Residents have until October 6 to register to vote in general election

EL PASO COUNTY – Last day to register to vote for the upcoming November 4th general election is Monday, October 6. As of September 20, El Paso County Elections department reported that, so far, a total of 402,097 county residents were registered to vote.


The general election – which will decide a number of issues including state constitutional amendments, national, state, county, city, school and water district office holders – will start with early voting slated for Monday, October 20 through Friday, October 31.

County officials announced that the last day to receive request for a ballot by mail (ABBM-Application for a Ballot by Mail) for civilian voters is Friday, October 24 (date received, not postmarked). Last day to receive request for a ballot by mail (FPCA-Federal Post Card Application) for military and overseas voters

is Tuesday, October 28, (date received, not postmarked).

As of 2011, voters are required to present an approved form of photo identification in order to vote in all Texas elections. Acceptable forms of photo identification includes Texas driver license issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS); Texas Election Identification Certificate issued by DPS; Texas personal identification card issued by DPS; Texas concealed handgun license issued by DPS; United States military identification card containing the person's photograph; United States citizenship certificate containing the person's photograph; and United States passport. With the exception of the U.S. citizenship certificate, the identification must be current or have expired no more than 60 days before being presented for voter qualification at the polling place.



Q: I thought there were just two parts to Medicare, but my mom said there are more. How many parts to *Medicare are there?*

A: There are four parts to Medicare:

- Part A (hospital insurance) helps pay for inpatient hospital care, skilled nursing care, hospice care and other services;
- Part B (doctor insurance) helps pay for doctors' fees, outpatient hospital visits and other medical services and supplies that are not covered by Part A;
- Part C (Medicare Advantage) plans, available in some areas, allow you to choose to receive all of your health care services through a provider organization. These plans may help lower your costs of receiving medical services, or you may get extra benefits for an Part C; and
- Part D (prescription drug coverage) is voluntary and helps cover the costs of prescription medications. Unlike Part B in which you are automatically enrolled and must opt out if you do not want it, with Part D you have to opt in by filling out a form and enrolling in an approved plan.

Q: How long do I need to work to become eligible for retirement benefits?
