Green chile harvest season fires up

EL PASO COUNTY – A genuine treat for El Paso County residents who enjoy fresh chile salsas and other chile dishes is the beginning of the green chile harvest this time of the year on the nearby farms in the Upper Valley. A process that lasts through October.

While some stores sell Mexican-grown green chile year-round, New Mexicogrown green chile should start hitting store shelves soon. And green-chile roasting machines will start appearing outside storefronts.

But a drive along scenic Highway 28 (the historic Don Juan de Onate trail) in Dona Ana County NM, beginning at the Texas state line in Canutillo, will take El Pasoans north through the rural communities of La Union, Berino, Chamberino, La Mesa, and San Miguel, where they will encounter roadside vegetable stands already selling the New Mexico chile and other fresh produce, very often at much lower prices than they would find at the big brand food markets.



Shooter wanted

Road rage leads to shots being fired in the parking lot of a Northeast El Paso business, and in another case on I-10 West. The same suspect is believed to be responsible for both shootings, and investigators from the El Paso Police Department, are asking for your help through Crime Stoppers. The first incident took place on Monday, May 25, 2015 at approximately 8:37 p.m. In this incident the victim was driving with her family, northbound on U.S. 54 and was exiting on Diana to go to the Sam's Club located at 9498 Diana. The suspect at one point was tailgating the victim and followed the victim into the parking lot of the business. The suspect attempted to cut the victims off to stop their vehicle. The victims managed to go around the suspect's vehicle, at which time the suspect fired a handgun at the victims. The second incident took place on Sunday, June 21, 2015 at 4:47 p.m. In this case, the victim was driving north on Loop 375 and merging on to I-10 West, and changed lanes to pass the suspect. As soon as the victim passed the suspect, he began to honk and yell at the victim. The suspect followed her on I-10 and reached for a handgun. The suspect began to fire the gun at the victim but the victim managed to slow down to avoid being struck. The suspect fled the scene at a high rate of speed on I-10 West. The suspect is described as a White or Hispanic male, thin build, in his 20s. In one of the cases he is described as having tattoos on both forearms. The vehicle is described as dark colored, 1990's model sport car similar to a Ford Mustang. In both of these cases the victims were not injured and no related injuries were reported. nets. Emergency funds and insurance are rarely discussed in combination. The traditional definition of an emergency fund is a separate account for cash that can be used instead of credit to repair a broken appliance or other expense that may run a few hundred dollars. However, many people keep insurance deductibles high to keep premiums low. Would you have enough cash on hand to cover an insurance deductible if you had a sudden claim? If not, build your deductible amounts into your emergency fund.

- 5. Eliminate debt. Though consumer debt levels have generally fallen since the 2008 financial crisis, the Federal Reserve Bank of New York reported in February that home, student loan, auto and credit card debt began creeping up again in 2014. Getting rid of revolving, non-housing debt (http://www.practicalmoneyskills.com/costofcredit) is one of the most effective ways to free up money for savings and investment.
- 6. Consider your career. Financial independence doesn't require you to quit a career you love, but you really can't get to financial independence without steady income to fuel savings and investments that will build over time. Speak with qualified advisors about your income, benefits and retirement picture first, and see if you might be able to expand your sources of work-related income, such as consulting part time. Also keep in mind that over the age of 50, the Internal Revenue Service allows you to make catch-up contributions (http:// www.irs.gov/Retirement-Plans/ Plan-Participant,-Employee/ Retirement-Topics-IRA-Contribution-Limits) to both 401(k) and IRA accounts.
- 7. Downsize. You'll generally reach wealth financial goals faster if you can cut your overall living expenses. For some, that means selling your home and moving to a smaller one or to an area with lower living costs and taxes. You can also sell or donate property you don't need and use those proceeds to extinguish debt or add to savings or investments.
- 8. Invest frugally. Become a student (http://www.dol. gov/ebsa/publications/

Chile peppers are direct-seeded in March and April, or transplants are started in greenhouses in February and planted in fields in April or May, depending on weather and other factors. Traditionally, green chiles are harvested beginning in late summer and continuing into the fall.

In the past, pods left to mature on the plant after the green harvest comprised the red chile crop. Today, the industry is highly segmented, and varieties have been developed specifically for green or red processing. The majority of red and paprika chiles produced are varieties specifically grown for that purpose.

Currently, green chile and jalapeños are just reaching their peak, a perfect time to find the freshest chile at the various produce stands dotting the Upper Valley roadway. The red chile harvest begins in late fall and continues into the winter months.





or destroyed cells. Some early work has been promising.

In my view, the technology is not yet ready for widespread clinical use. I don't recommend it. There are many new medications for Parkinson's disease, and I have recommended nonpharmacologic therapy, including exercise, several times. I strongly recommend evaluation by an expert, preferably a neurologist experienced in Parkinson's disease.

A reader recently wrote to tell me that treatment of his vitamin D deficiency greatly relieved his Parkinson's symptoms.
