



'DWI Not So Fun House'

As summer celebrations enter their final weeks, the Texas Department of Transportation is taking its "DWI Not So Fun House" to community events across the state as part of its "Drink, Drive, Go to Jail" campaign. The vintage-style interactive carnival trailer allows the public to experience the dangerous and potentially deadly effects of impaired driving."Don't turn your summer fun into a life-changing tragedy by being irresponsible when it comes to drinking and driving," said **TxDOT** Deputy Executive Director John Barton. "A safe and sober ride should be at the top of your list when making plans with family and friends. If not, you run the serious risk of being pulled over by law enforcement, being killed or killing someone else. It's just not worth it." The "DWI Not So Fun House" allows visitors to see and experience the simulated effects of alcohol on motor skills and driving. Participants wear vision-blurring "drunk goggles" and try to complete simple, eyehand coordination tasks while being "impaired." The slowed reaction times and distorted perception are designed to remind Texans about the deadly risks of drinking and driving, and encourage them to always plan for a sober ride. Last summer in Texas, 336 people were killed and 680 were seriously injured in alcohol-related crashes. Texas drivers convicted of DWI face up to \$17,000 in costs, possible jail time, limited career prospects and loss of driver license. In an effort to curb impaired driving, TxDOT's "Drink, Drive, Go to Jail" campaign is supported by increased law enforcement efforts between Aug. 21 and Sept. 7. TxDOT strongly encourages everyone to plan for a sober ride before going out. Visit SoberRides.org to find alternatives to drinking and driving, such as:

Northeast El Paso residents oppose development

EL PASO COUNTY - Northeast El Paso residents aired their concerns during a recent Open Space Advisory Board (OSAB) meeting held at city offices on Texas Street regarding a proposed housing development that encompasses land that lies adjacent to Castner Range and stretches along the slopes of the del Puente. Franklin Mountains.

The residents met with OSAB members to convey to city officials that they want the land to remain in its natural state.

About 100 individuals showed up for Cook, former mayor of El Paso; Carl Robinson, city representative of District 4; Joe Moody, state representative; and Larry Nichols, director of City of El Paso Planning and Inspections Department.

Spearheading the push to gain city officials' attention about its opposition to

Developer Daniel T. Knapp is proposing residential development in the area that is zoned as planned mountain development. He has already submitted a land study application with the city for the initial 175-acre section that he has named Sierra

The concerned citizens group went to the OSAB meeting because its members are the ones who make recommendations to city council about lands that should the housing development is a group calling be acquired for open space designation. itself Save our Sierras (SOS), which is a City council, in turn, can use funds committee within the Franklin Mountains from several sources to purchase these lands and convert them into open space

Some of these funds can come from Franklin Mountain State Park, located the 2012 Quality of Life bonds, which set aside monies for the acquisition of open space. Also, the El Paso Water Utilities has storm-water funds that can be transferred to the city to purchase open space. Additionally, city development regulations contain various incentives to encourage property owners to dedicate land to open space.

During the OSAB meeting's public Knapp's application for building 319 comments period, SOS members voiced several issues of concern regarding the adverse effects of the proposed development. They stated that there are numerous homes currently for sale in the area so there is no need for more homes. They pointed out that the proposed development will add to the water shortage in El Paso County and that proposed homes will be built in a flood zone which will create a problem for homeowners downhill of the development.



Under state law, the dollar amount of school taxes imposed on the residence homestead of a person 65 years of age or older or of the surviving spouse of such a person, if the surviving spouse was 55 years of age or older when the person died, may not be increased above the amount paid in the first year after the person turned 65, regardless of changes in the tax rate or property value.

Notice of Rollback Rate: The highest tax rate the district can adopt before requiring voter approval at an election is 1.462981. This election will be automatically held if the district adopts a rate in excess of the rollback rate of 1.462981.





2015 Property Tax Rates in El Paso **County Emergency Services District #2**

This notice concerns 2015 property tax rates for the El Paso County Emergency Services District #2. It presents information about three tax rates. Last year's tax rate is the actual rate the taxing unit used to determine property taxes last year. This year's effective tax rate would impose the same total taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. This year's rollback tax rate is the highest tax rate the taxing unit can set before taxpayers can start tax rollback procedures. In each case these rates are found by dividing the total amount of taxes by the tax base (the total value of taxable property) with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of property value.
