County's health ranking improves

EL PASO COUNTY - El Paso County residents seem to be moving in a positive direction when it comes to choosing a healthy lifestyle.

A recent study released by the County Health Rankings & Roadmaps program has El Paso ranking 80th out of 243 Texas counties in overall health. Last year, the El Paso region ranked 105th in the same annual survey. The study, which is in its eighth year, is designed to measure a number of factors including health behaviors, clinical care, and social, economic and physical environments. The data gathering was completed by researchers under the auspices of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation and the University of Wisconsin Population Health Institute. The study works to identify a county's problems and implement solutions to make it easier for people to be healthy, according to Mary Bennett, the community coach for County Health Rankings & Roadmaps and with

We recently lost a dear relative to cholangiocarcinoma. He had served in the Navy in Vietnam. The probable cause of his cancer was from a parasite, a river fluke, which is common to that region. available? – J.A.E.

I am sorry to hear about your relative. Cholangiocarcinoma is cancer of the bile duct, a rare cancer. Liver flukes are a risk factor, and so is a condition called primary sclerosing cholangitis, ulcerative colitis. The cancer is rare but highly lethal, because by the time symptoms show up, the cancer usually is advanced.

Also because of its rarity, screening for the cancer in a general population won't be effective. However, for people at high risk, such as those with PSC or a history of liver parasites, at least one study usually a gastroenterologist, about screening.

A man is killed at the hands of a hit and run driver in El Paso's Mission Valley. The El Paso Police Department is asking for the public's help in identifying this hit and run driverthroughCrimeStoppers. Moments in Time The History Channel

• On May 1, 1926, Ford Motor Company becomes one of the first companies in America to adopt a fiveday, 40-hour week for its automotive factory workers. Other manufacturers soon followed Ford's lead, and the Monday-to-Friday workweek became standard.

• On May 2, 1964, an explosion of a charge assumed to have been placed by Viet Cong terrorists sinks the USNS Card at its dock in Saigon. No one was injured and the ship was eventually raised and repaired.

• On May 3, 1952, a skimodified U.S. Air Force C-47 becomes the first aircraft to land on the North Pole. Lt. Col. Joseph Fletcher walked to the exact geographic North Pole, probably the first person ever to do so.

• On May 4, 1970, National Guardsmen open fire on a group of unarmed antiwar demonstrators at Kent State University in Ohio, killing four students and wounding nine. The nearest casualty was 20 yards away. A federal court later dropped all charges against eight Ohio National Guardsmen.

• On May 5, 1776, British Lt. Gen. Henry Clinton issues a proclamation denouncing North Carolina patriots' "wicked rebellion" and recommends that the inhabitants return their allegiance to the king. Although he offered full pardons to all persons, it was not a success and he abandoned the area.

• On May 6, 1994, a rail tunnel under the English Channel officially opens, connecting Britain and the European mainland for the first time since the Ice Age. The "Chunnel" runs below the seabed for 23 miles. Each day, about 30,000 people, 6,000 cars and 3,500 trucks journey through the Chunnel.
