Socorro ISD rewarded for strong financial accountability

EL PASO COUNTY – The Socorro Independent School District has earned three Transparency Stars from the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts program, which recognizes local governments for going above and beyond in their financial transparency efforts.

The stars earned are for traditional finance, debt obligations and contracts and procurement. SISD is one of two school districts in the state that earned the three stars.

"We are proud of this recognition because it shows we are committed to maintaining a fiscally responsible budget, investing in our students and employees,

while remaining transparent with our community," said Tony Reza, SISD Chief Financial Officer.

Team SISD is committed to maintaining financial integrity, full disclosure and responsibly managing taxpayer funds, and has earned other various other recognitions in this realm.

For seven consecutive years, Socorro ISD has earned an A in the School Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas. SISD scored 98 points out of 100 possible points on the ratings, the highest among school districts in the region. The rating cites the district as accountable in financial management practices and providing the maximum allocation for instructional purposes.

The district also earned the 2016 Texas Association of School Business Officials

Award of Merit for Purchasing & Operations for maintaining professional standards in the acquisition of goods and services.

In addition, the Fitch Rating Agency reaffirmed strong bond ratings for SISD maintaining its underlying financial rating of AA. Factors that support the AA rating include the District's above average revenue growth, revenue raising capacity, strong gap-closing capacity and low fixed costs. Moody's Investors Service assigned SISD an Aa2 underlying bond rating based on a stable financial outlook and an Aaa enhanced rating based on a guarantee from the Texas Permanent School Fund. Moody's cited the district's robust financial position, large and growing tax base, and manageable pension burden.

Public Notice Tornillo Independent School District SECTION 504 SERVICES

The Tornillo Independent School District provides the following educational services/options to identified students with disabilities who reside within the district.

- ◆ Child find activities to notify students with disabilities and their parents of their rights and the district’s obligation to provide a free, appropriate public education.
- ◆ Referrals to Sections 504 when it is believed the students have a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities and the students are in need of educational accommodations.
- ◆ Procedural safeguards under Section 504.
- ◆ Evaluations of students to determine eligibility for the Section 504 program.
- ◆ Placement into the Section 504 program, which means the student may receive:
 - ✓ individually planned modifications in the regular classroom,
 - ✓ transportation services to and from school,
 - ✓ health services from the school nurse,
 - ✓ accommodations regarding access to any part of the campus, or
 - ✓ assistance in reading for students with dyslexia in a reading program which meets the state’s standards for a dyslexia reading program.
- ◆ Special education services are available to Section 504 students, if the students qualify for one of the specific disabilities under special education.

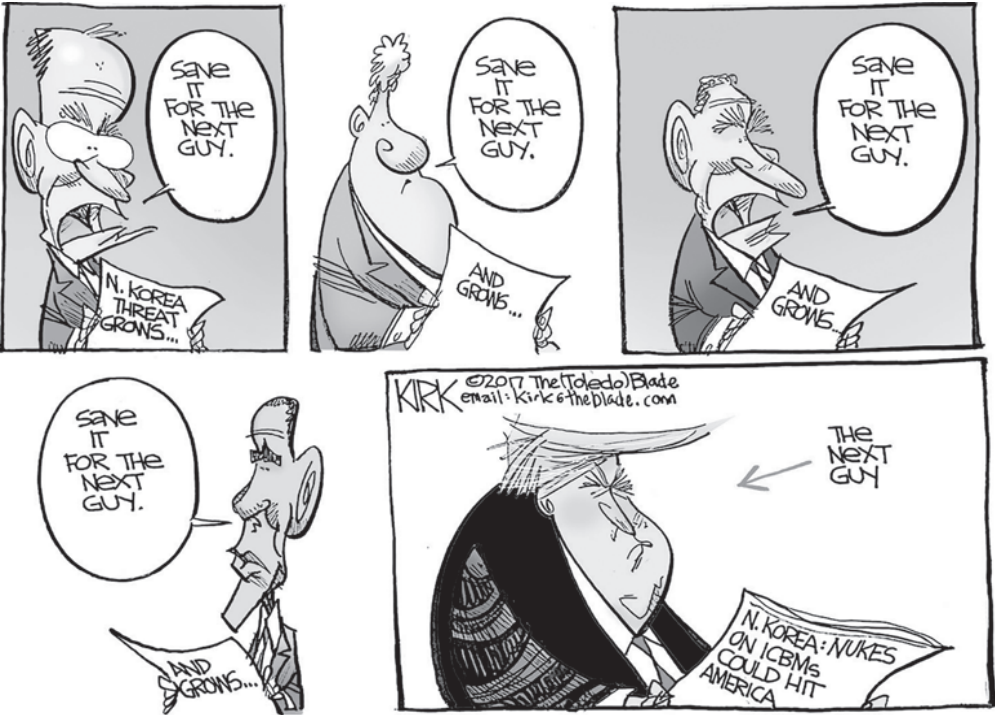
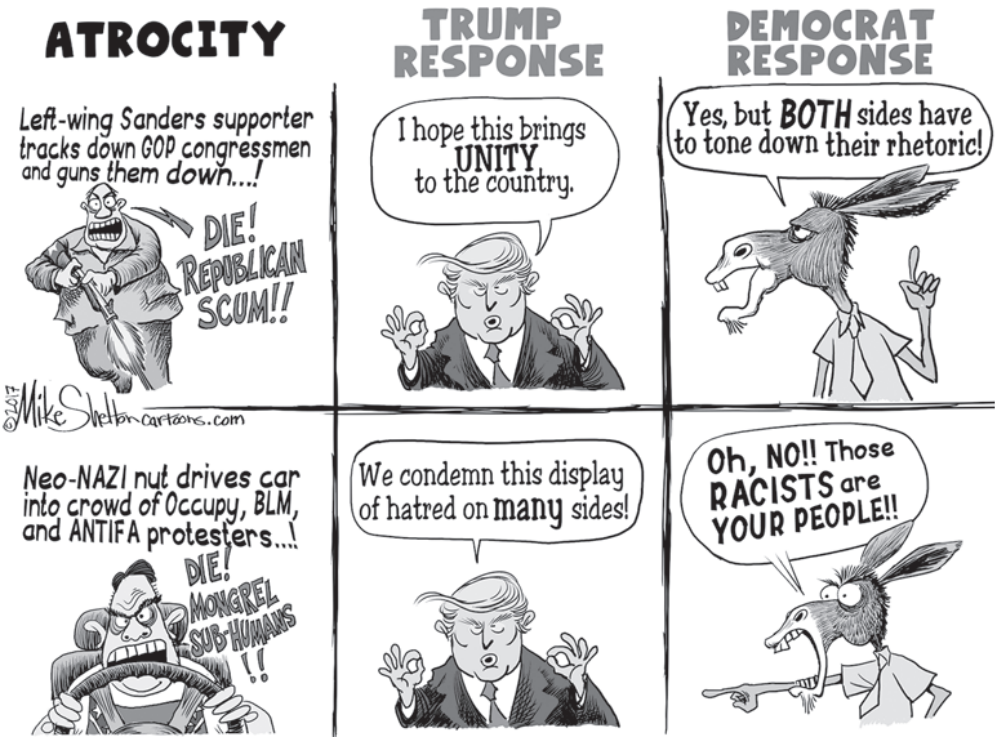

Hard to fire bad VA employees

The Department of Veterans Affairs doesn't typically air its dirty laundry in public, but a recent press release included the headline "MSPB forces VA to take back fired official" – just when we thought they were able to unload bad employees.

In April 2017, the director of a VA medical center was demoted. The center kept running out of critical supplies because it had no inventory system, and the surgical supplies they did have were frequently kept in dirty storage areas. The VA Office of the Inspector General report used the phrase "the highest level of chaos." In three years there had been over 190 reports of compromised patient safety. Multiple serious surgeries had to be canceled due to lack of equipment. In short, the place was a mess. The VA demoted the medical director within hours.

In June, President Donald Trump signed the VA Accountability Act, which speeds the process of getting rid of rotten employees.

Enter the VAOIG, which found another reason to fire the guy: As part of yet another investigation of this employee, it discovered he had been sending VA emails to his personal accounts as well as to his wife, emails that contained sensitive personnel info as far back as 2012. He refused to give her email address, claiming spousal privilege (which didn't stop the VAOIG from finding it, of course). The guy was fired.

One day later, the Merit Systems Protection Board issued a stay order: The VA couldn't fire the guy until the MSPB waded through his claim of a wrongful termination. The former director is back at work, on the payroll, but in a role that keeps him away from patient care. The Office of Special Counsel will assess the information in light of the act the president signed in June.

- On Sept. 4, 1972, U.S. swimmer Mark Spitz wins his record seventh gold medal at the 1972 Summer Olympics in Munich. The record would stand until Michael Phelps took home eight gold medals at the Beijing Games in 2012.
- On Sept. 5, 1666, firefighters in London begin blowing up homes in a desperate attempt to halt the spread of a great fire through the city. By the time the fire was finally extinguished the following day, more than 100,000 people had been left homeless.
- On Sept. 6, 1915, a prototype tank nicknamed Little Willie rolls off the assembly line in England. Little Willie was far from a success. It weighed 14 tons, overheated, got stuck in trenches and crawled over rough terrain at only 2 mph.

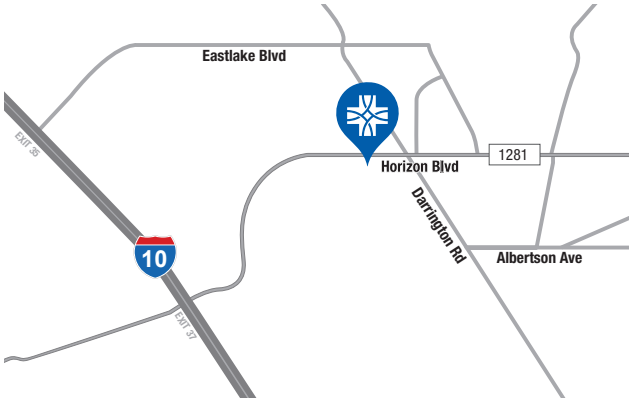

It’s a big fight

Floyd Mayweather and Conor McGregor’s world press tour was a brilliant marketing scheme that now has the entire world talking about the fight.

Mayweather, at 49-0, is putting it all on the line to go 50-0, eclipsing Rocky Marciano’s record of 49 straight wins. He is a master showman and knows how to push people’s buttons better than anyone since Muhammad Ali. For at least his past 20 fights, Mayweather has played the villain, and he plays it with such sincerity that it’s really

hard for a lot of people to root for him... but you’ll watch, and he’ll keep cashing those \$100 million checks.

But Conor McGregor also is undefeated as a boxer. And he is a WORLD CHAMPION fighter. He is not a novice by any means. In terms of the pre-fight smack talk, there is little doubt that McGregor had the bigger mouth (and funnier lines) but that being said, the incessant profanities and racial allegations have unfortunately ruined much of that tour for posterity. Mayweather,

And while the clip of the fight shows a definite push and not a knockdown, the 20 seconds before that showed sweat spraying off Malignaggi’s head and him bailing into the ropes. It was an unfair fight because Paulie is older and out of shape, but I’m certain Paulie very much got the better of him in the early rounds.

But the films – and his highlight reels from the UFC – show that McGregor has stunning accuracy and is a killer counterpuncher. He says he can break Mayweather’s guard, and I believe him. His biggest worry is being disqualified for an illegal strike.

My money’s on McGregor. We soon shall see.
