Tigua statue defaced, vandals sought

EL PASO COUNTY - A bronze statue of a Tigua woman named Nestora Granillo Piarote was vandalized between 12:30 and 7:30 a.m., on Columbus Day, Monday, October 9. The statue measures 12 feet tall, weighs 1.5 tons and sits on a 7-foot elevated base. Red paint was poured onto the statue and a red wooden cross was placed in front of it. The FBI said the cross had white letters on it that apparently spelled "Columbus Day".

The statue stands in front of the Tigua Indian Cultural Center (305 Yaya Lane and Socorro Road) in El Paso County's lower valley. Two weeks into the investigation the Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI), El Paso Police Department, and Tigua Tribal Police Office continue to follow leads in their joint efforts to apprehend the individual or individuals responsible for the damage caused to the statue.

To encourage the public's assistance in solving this case a \$10,000 reward made up of \$6,000 from the FBI, \$2,000 from the Tigua tribe, and \$2,000 from the Sociedad Cultural de Espana cultural group - has been posted. The reward is for information leading to the arrest of the person(s) that poured the paint on the Nestora Granillo Piarote Memorial Statue. FBI and Tigua tribal officials announced the reward during a recent news conference.

The statue was unveiled during a







Fabens students visit Hueco Tanks

FABENS – Three academic clubs from Fabens High School joined together for a Hueco Tanks field trip on Saturday, September 30. A total of 23 students from the Eukaryotes Science Club, National Art Honor Society and National History Club hiked approximately 8 miles with volunteer guides who tailored the tour to suit the group's varying interests.

National History Club sponsor Carol Basil organized the trip to emphasize that not all learning has to occur indoors. "So much of a student's day is spent inside. They really don't get outdoors often enough," she said. "I wanted my students

to see that studying history doesn't have to be done at a desk all the time."

Students learned about the petroglyphs, pictographs and the ancient tribes that produced them. From a scientific perspective, the students learned of the medicinal properties of the region's plants and magma rock formations. The art students in the group were taught to create a paint brush from plant leaves.

Mrs. Basil believes the lessons from hiking are invaluable. "Students get a lot more knowledge that they wouldn't have gotten from just a lecture from me," she said

The three clubs are planning their next joint field trip to the El Paso Museum of Art and the El Paso Holocaust Museum sometime in the spring.

Moments in Time The History Channel

- On Nov. 6, 1977, the Toccoa Falls Dam in Georgia bursts, and the resulting flash flood kills 39 people. The day before, a volunteer fireman had inspected the 100-year-old Earthen dam above the falls and found everything in order.
- On Nov. 7, 1944, Franklin Roosevelt is re-elected president of the United States for a record third time, defeating Thomas Dewey, the governor of New York, and becoming the only president in history to win a fourth term in office.
- On Nov. 8, 1895, in his lab in Germany, physicist Wilhelm Conrad Rontgen becomes the first person to observe X-rays while testing whether cathode rays could pass through glass. Rontgen received numerous accolades for his work, including the first Nobel Prize in physics in 1901.
- On Nov. 9, 1938, German Nazis launch a campaign of terror against Jews in Germany and Austria. The violence was dubbed "Kristallnacht," or "Night of Broken Glass," for the countless

- smashed windows of 7,500 Jewishowned establishments. Some 100 Jews died, and hundreds of synagogues and homes were damaged.
- On Nov. 10, 1964, Secretary of Defense Robert McNamara says that the United States has no plans to send combat troops into Vietnam. By 1969, more than 500,000 American troops were in South Vietnam.
- On Nov. 11, 2000, a cable car taking skiers to a glacier in Austria catches fire as it passes through a mountain tunnel; 156 people die. Only 11 people survived the fire, which was caused by an illegal space heater in the driver's cabin.
- On Nov. 12, 1980, the U.S. planetary probe Voyager 1 edges within 77,000 miles of Saturn, sending back 30,000 images that show hundreds of rings encircling the planet. Voyager 1, now in interstellar space, contains a disk featuring natural and manmade sounds of Earth.
