Area early colleges are 10 years old

Northwest Early College High School (NECHS) held a celebration on May 16,2018 to commemorate the school's opening in 2008. A ceremony was held in the school's grotto to honor current students, faculty and graduates. This was followed by a fun-filled Field Day at the adjacent West Side Soccer Complex. "EPCC will be marking the 10th anniversary of two of its 12 early college high schools this summer: Northwest Early College High School, in partnership with Canutillo ISD, and Transmountain Early College High School, with El Paso ISD, both opened in July 2008," Tonie Badillo, Dean of Dual Credit and Early College High Schools (ECHS) said. "EPCC's early college high school initiative has provided a unique opportunity to the youth in our region to earn an associate's degree while in high school." ECHS initiative is designed to allow students to simultaneously earn a high school diploma and an associate's degree in four years. The ECHS must target and enroll students who are historically underrepresented in higher education, including economically disadvantaged, firstgeneration, English language learners and minority students.

Commissioners approve fire station near Horizon

EL PASO COUNTY – El Paso County Commissioners Court approved recently plans for the El Paso County Emergency Services District (ESD) No. 1 to build a new fire station in the county's far east community.

During a recent council meeting, commissioners unanimously gave the green light for a \$3 million loan to address the emergency services needs of the residential and commercial developments that are expanding rapidly in the area.

Menendez stated in a recent news report that the fire station is necessary because his department, which is composed of 1 region. about 60 volunteer firefighters, has seen a significant increase in call volumes in the families moving into the 79928 zip code last few years.

The ESD responded to 1400 calls in fiscal year 2011-12, which increased by 148 percent to 3,474 calls in fiscal year 2016-17, according to officials. So far this fiscal year, the ESD has responded to County officials indicated that the loan nearly 1,600 calls. Presently, ESD No. 1

The area where the new fire station is going to be constructed is growing at a ESD No. 1 Fire Chief Kristian rate 11 times faster than the city of El Paso, according to County Commissioner Vince Perez, who represents the ESD No.

Perez said that there are a lot of new area, where the new station is going to be built. He said that the area saw a 30 percent increase in population from 2011 to 2016. The population increased from 44,205 to 57,415 residents.

ESD No. 1 officials said that the new fire station will be built east of Loop 375 and north of Interstate 10 near Eastlake High School, at the corner of Paseo del Este and Mission Ridge Boulevards. Menendez stated that the construction of the fire station is expected to begin in June 2019 and that it would take about a year to complete.

The \$3 million is expected to cover the construction of the facility and equipment inside the building. ESD officials stated that once the building is ready, plans are to move two fire trucks and a pickup truck to the new facility. The fire department currently has 14 units, including five fire trucks, he said. Menendez said that the second station within the district will help improve response times in the area. He reported that currently there are areas in which the fire department takes up to 15 minutes to respond. The new station is expected to help cut the response times by half, he added. In addition, the new fire station will help lower the fire insurance ratings for homeowners, according to Menendez. He said that homeowners will be able to save between 30 to 35 percent in the fire

CANUTILLO - Starting pay for teachers in the Canutillo Independent School District will reach the \$50,000 mark starting in the 2018-19 school year after the Board of Trustees approved a compensation package that gives all employees a salary increase.

The new salary package for CISD employees increased the salary for teachers with zero year's experience to \$50,000, up from the \$47,500 they receive this year. This makes teachers in Canutillo among the highest paid in El Paso County.

"We appreciate our teachers and employees and we wanted to give them a compensation package that matches their commitment to our students and community," said Superintendent Pedro

Board approved this week includes a 2 percent general pay increases for all employees. The Board will approve the \$56.2-million budget for the 2018-19 school year later this summer.

Canutillo's compensation plan also makes adjustments to teacher stipends. Some of the stipend increases include \$2,500 to \$3,000 for secondary math and science teachers, as well as \$1,500 to \$2,500 for self-contained special education teachers.

Administrators said the stipend changes were necessary.

"The teaching field stipends we have approved will keep us competitive with peer districts in El Paso," said Martha Carrasco, CISD's Chief Human Resources Officer. "We know that in



Adult vaccines help immune systems

DEAR DR. ROACH: I was wondering what adult vaccines should be given to enhance the immune system, in addition to improving sleep and diet. – P.P.

Our bodies' immune systems are designed to protect

us from outside invaders (bacteria, viruses, fungi, parasites) as well as internal errors (cancers), and they are very effective at doing so. Unfortunately, the germs and abnormal growths also are skilled at avoiding our immune systems, so there is a constant struggle going on. Giving your body proper nutrition and rest, and managing stress



help your immune system perform at its best.

Vaccines improve your body's ability to fight off particular infections, increasing your immunity to very specific bacteria and viruses. The vaccines that are generally recommended for healthy adults are:

• Flu vaccine (yearly);

• Tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis once, then tetanus/ diphtheria every 10 years;

- Human papillomavirus (three doses, up to age 26);
- Zoster, the shingles vaccine (once after age 60); and
- Pneumococcal vaccine (PCV13 once, PPSV23 once or twice).

Depending on the person's past history and risk factors, other vaccines – including the measles, mumps and rubella vaccine; meningococcal vaccine; hepatitis A and B vaccines; and haemophilus vaccine – also may be recommended. International travelers may need others. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention maintains the most recent recommendations on its website at www.vaccineinformation.org.

DEAR DR. ROACH: This may seem like a trivial concern in comparison to some of the matters you address in your column, but it is a concern of mine. My spouse passes gas throughout the night. He claims that he is asleep and unaware of any problems. I say that this is a voluntary activity and that he should be able to control it. Who is right? -D.B.

He is. Passing gas while asleep is entirely involuntary. You probably are doing so also while asleep. If you are really bothered by his intestinal gas, then you can work on some dietary changes, including avoiding carbonated beverages and limiting foods that commonly cause the intestinal bacteria to produce gas, such




