College debt

With college students going back to school and 10.7 percent of all student loans 90+ days delinquent or in default as of Q1 2018, the personal-finance website WalletHub has released its report on 2018's *States with the Most and Least Student Debt*. To determine the states that are friendliest toward student-loan debtors, WalletHub compared the 50 states and the District of Columbia across 11 key metrics. The data set ranges from average student debt to unemployment rate among the population aged 25 to 34 to share of students with past-due loan balances. Texas was 35th in the study, ranking:

- 38th – Avg. Student Debt;
- 31st – Proportion of Students with Debt;
- 24th – Student Debt as % of Income (Adjusted for Cost of Living);
- 27th – Unemployment Rate of Population Aged 25 to 34;
- 23rd – % of Student Loans Past Due or in Default;
- 35th – % of Student-Loan Borrowers Aged 50+;
- 24th – Availability of Student Jobs;
- 31st – Availability of Paid Internships; and
- 12th – Grant Growth.

Tornillo shelter to stay open another 30 days

TORNILLO – About 130 unaccompanied minors are still being housed in tent structures at the Marcelino Serna Tornillo Port of Entry in Tornillo, Texas, according to State Representative Cesar Blanco.

Blanco and five other members of the Mexican American Legislative Caucus of the Texas House visited the facility recently to meet with federal officials and leaders from BCFS, the San Antonio-based nonprofit currently running day-to-day operations. Touring the site along with Rep. Blanco were State Representatives Diego Bernal, Mary Gonzalez, Ina Minjarez, Eddie Rodriguez, and Gina Hinojosa.

The temporary tent shelters for immigrant children at the Tornillo port of entry will stay open for at least another month at their current capacity, Blanco

related.

The facility was scheduled to close on Monday, August 13, the date when the federal government's latest contract with BCFS was slated to expire. But a spokesperson with the Department of Health and Human Services Administration for Children and Families in a public statement indicated that the government would continue operations in Tornillo for an additional 30 days, setting the new closing date for September 13.

Blanco stated that officials at the Tornillo facility told lawmakers on tour that there are no plans to accept 4,000 additional minors at the shelter as initially reported. The original request for a contractor to operate the shelter included the possibility of increasing the capacity to as many as 4,000 beds; but, so far, the shelter, which opened with 400 available beds, has not increased its capacity, according to officials.

The tent structures at the port of entry were erected in June to serve as temporary

housing for minors apprehended crossing the border alone and those who were separated from their parents under the Trump administration's zero tolerance immigration policy.

The minors who are still living at the shelter are boys between the ages of 13 and 17, who were apprehended crossing the border without an adult, Blanco stated. The shelter once had as many as 326 children, including girls and children separated from their parents at the border.

State Representative González, who is from Clint, criticized the lack of transparency in the current process for operating the shelter. “This is happening every 30 days,” she said at the recent press conference after meeting with officials at the shelter. “The lack of transparency, the lack of a process really makes it difficult for advocates and policymakers to make decisions. If it changes every 30 days, if it's for 400 or 4,000- that's a big difference,” Gonzalez asserted.

The Turkish hostage crisis

It's never a good idea to negotiate with a hostage-taker, but when it's a NATO ally, there isn't much choice. The Trump administration has been trying to get back a Christian pastor detained in Turkey since October 2016, and when a possible deal at the sidelines of the NATO summit fell through, decided to drop the hammer. The administration sanctioned Turkey's justice and interior ministers – remember, these are top officials of a fellow NATO country. The action hit the Turkish currency and stock market hard.

Then President Donald Trump intervened in his inimitable style, with a tweet promising a doubling of aluminum and steel tariffs against the country and pointedly noting the drop in the value of the lira.

As always, the president's shoot-from-the-lip style is open to question, but Turkey deserved every last character – including the two exclamation points – in that presidential tweet. Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan is not Justin Trudeau or Angela Merkel, a leader firmly within the liberal West who annoys Trump. He's an Islamist authoritarian who is fundamentally changing the character of an erstwhile ally.

Erdogan's resort to hostage-taking as a tactic to gain leverage over allies – it's not just us – is a barbarous throwback and a disgusting homage to rogue states like Iran and North Korea. He also has grabbed a Turkish-American NASA scientist and local employees of American consulates.

The case against the pastor, the highest-profile case, is ludicrous. Andrew Brunson lived with his family in a seaside city, Izmir, for more than 20 years until the government, after Erdogan survived a coup, decided that he was guilty of aiding terrorist organizations and military espionage.

The alleged supporting evidence is a collection of absurdities – a video of a traditional Arab dish sent to Brunson by his daughter, a church member texting the pastor about missing a service, a photo of him with a man in a scarf bearing certain colors, and so on.

What this clearly is about is holding Brunson to try to



get Fethullah Gulen, a former Erdogan ally and cleric who lives on a farm in Pennsylvania. With great fervency but little evidence, the Turkish government accuses Gulen of being behind the shadowy July 15, 2016, coup that became an occasion for Erdogan to seize emergency powers and purge the state and civil society of his political enemies. This isn't a trade the U.S. should be willing to make.

Erdogan blames an "economic war" for his country's dire economic straits. He should instead blame his own mismanagement. Turkey was already vulnerable to an end of the era of cheap capital, even before it pursued a course of confrontation with a country vastly richer and more powerful than it is.

There were always going to be stresses in the U.S.-Turkish alliance; Turkey views the Kurds as a threat, and we consider them allies. But the chief cause of the radical deterioration in the relationship is Turkey's rank anti-Americanism, a paranoia stoked at every turn by Erdogan for his own cynical purposes.

He is now reaping what he sowed, and if Erdogan wants relief, his first step should be releasing the hostages.

The Tornillo Independent School District provides the following educational services/ options to identified students with disabilities who reside within the district.

- ◆ Child find activities to notify students with disabilities and their parents of their rights and the district's obligation to provide a free, appropriate public education.

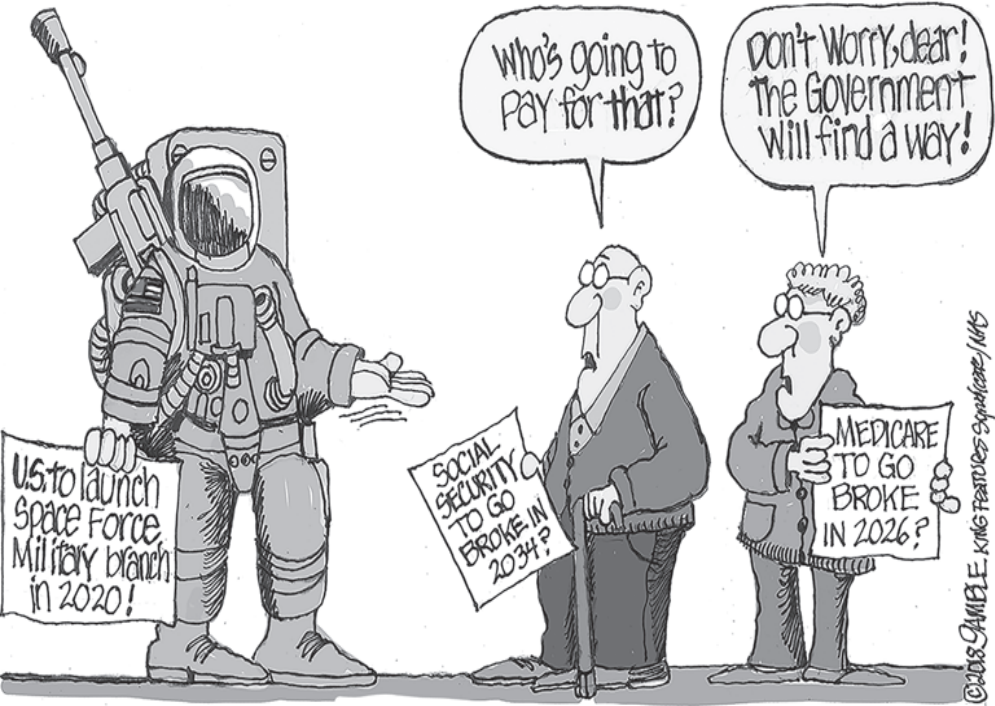
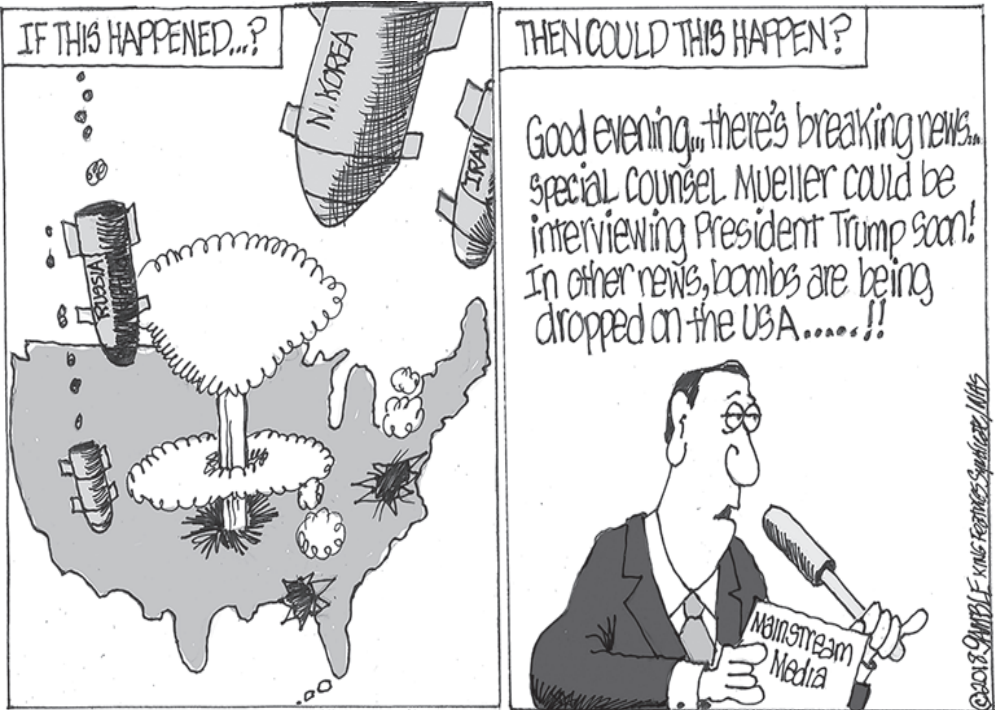

GO FIGURE! by Linda Thistle

The idea of Go Figure is to arrive at the figures given at the bottom and right-hand columns of the diagram by following the arithmetic signs in the order they are given (that is, from left to right and top to bottom). 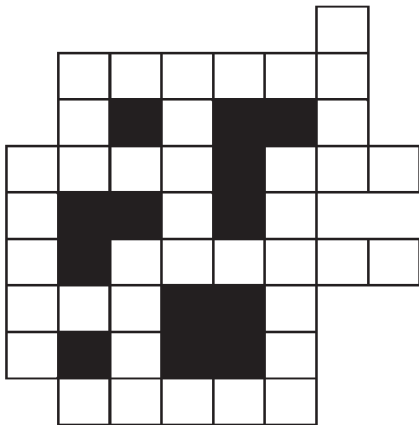

Education benefits expanded again

The Forever GI Bill has expanded again, this time by 15 provisions, adding to the 13 from last year. The bill, aka The Harry W. Colmery Veterans Educational Assistance Act of 2017, provides an increasing number of education benefits to veterans, active duty, their families and survivors.

Here are some of the provisions that have just taken effect:

- Veteran and military families who have lost a family member who was getting education benefits can reallocate those benefits.
- Additional Guard and Reserve service now counts toward eligibility.
- The Yellow Ribbon Program is expanded, making more funds available for more students.
- Housing allowance is available for days not on active duty.
- Purple Heart recipients after Sept. 11, 2001 are eligible for benefits for 36 months.
- The Department of Veterans Affairs is developing

a pilot program for high-tech training and skills.

- The Survivors’ and Dependents’ program is expanding from 36 to 45 months, and the monthly allowance is going up, starting in October.

- In addition, there are changes to monthly housing based on ZIP code, and restoration of benefits when schools close or a course of study is canceled.

the thigh and another on the arm. Sometimes, an angiogram is necessary.

Since it’s really the same disease as coronary artery disease and cerebrovascular disease, people with PAD are at much higher risk for heart attack and stroke. Although we cannot, in general, cure PAD, we have many different kinds of treatments to reduce risk of catastrophic events and to improve symptoms.

Treatment starts with modifying existing risk factors, especially smoking, which is the most powerful modifiable risk. A proper diet that cuts down on excess unhealthy fats and simple

sugars is important. A monitored exercise program, gradually increasing in duration and intensity, can have a dramatic effect on function. Most people will benefit from statin drugs and anti-platelet drugs, such as aspirin.
