Canutillo ISD governance program

The Canutillo Independent School District School Board is one of only eight in the state to be selected by the Texas Education Agency to participate in the Lone Star Governance Exemplar Cohort – an intensive program aimed at helping school districts improve student outcomes. "The leadership at these eight school districts are already demonstrating effective governance practices where the success of every student is the focus," said Commissioner of Education Mike Morath. "As part of the inaugural LSG Exemplar Cohort, the school board members and superintendents in these districts seek to take their efforts to the next level, which can lead better student outcomes in their communities." LSG Exemplar Cohort members will be sharing best practices from their experiences to help strengthen leadership in districts statewide. "Through this governance process the board and administration will continue to grow together to better understand how to best serve our students and sustain our A-rated district," said Superintendent Dr. Pedro Galaviz.

San Eli HS seniors register to vote





"Students need to know about the importance of becoming registered voters and making their voices heard," Negrete said. Negrete gave a brief presentation to a handful of students about the current voting practices in El Paso County. She answered questions from students and presented a few specifics on the voting process. "As a citizen of this country, I cannot stress the importance of registering to vote," said Obed Hernandez (front row, right), Government and Economics teacher at SEHS. "Your vote is your voice in the political process. Politics nowadays is very polarized and it can be scary for high school students, but knowing that you are registered to vote puts you in the right direction into getting your voice heard no matter which politician you favor." The 2018 U.S. elections will be held on Tuesday, Nov. 6th and students who registered to vote will receive their Voter Registration Card a few days before. • Two tournaments each month (entry fee, \$6). One dollar from each entry fee is set aside to pay for a social dinner that is held in September. The rest of the money is returned as monetary prizes to the winners of each tournament.

Reducing eye strain

DEAR DR. ROACH: Would you mind providing some guidelines for preventing eye strain? I'm a graduate student, so I spend a lot of time reading, both from computer screens and from books. I will always need to read to get things done, but I'd also like my eyes to last me my whole life. -B.I.

We tend to spend a lot of time reading or in front of computer screens, and eye strain is very common. I think eye problems

from excess screen time and reading fall into two categories: dry eyes and muscle strain.

Computer users in particular can get dry eyes, largely from blinking. And decreased "blink more" isn't likely to be successful advice, so I recommend an eye lubricant, used periodically during computer work if you have any sense of eye fatigue or strain. If



dry eyes are part of your problem, you will feel relief immediately, and you should use a drop in each eye every few hours.

Muscle strain comes from staring at one point of focus – your computer screen – for long periods of time. Also, many people tend to hold their shoulders and neck in an uncomfortable position during computer work or play. The solution is to get away from the computer for a while. I recommend getting up and pacing periodically, since prolonged sitting isn't good for vou.

Another option is the 20-20-20 rule (I haven't been able to discover who made the rule, but I think it makes sense): Look at something 20 feet away for 20 seconds every 20 minutes. This can help prevent fatigue to the ciliary muscles, the muscles of the eye. Some people, especially those who are nearing or past their 50th birthday, might benefit from very mild reading glasses when using the computer.

There is a science behind adjusting your workspace, lighting and monitor settings to reduce strain. There are apps to remind you to take breaks periodically and to change the color of your computer to make it easier on the eyes.

DEAR DR. ROACH: I have had nail fungus since 1985 in both my toenails and my fingernails. I was treated with oral Lamisil, but it did nothing for my big toe. I have been treated by skin and foot specialists, but the problem has continued progressively over the years. I am 80 years old, and it's still there. Is there really any hope for cases like mine? -C.J.R.

Are you sure you really want the condition treated? The




