Immigration impact

With immigration reform remaining one of the biggest policy issues in 2019 and border security taking center stage in the longest government shutdown in history, the personal-finance website WalletHub has released its report on 2019's Economic Impact of Immigration by State as well as accompanying videos. In order to determine which states benefit most from immigration, WalletHub compared the 50 states and the District of Columbia across 20 key metrics, ranging from median household income of foreign-born population to jobs generated by immigrantowned businesses as a share of total jobs. Texas placed 14th in this study, ranking:

- 16th Percent of Jobs Generated by Immigrant-Owned Businesses Out of Total Jobs;
- 42nd Net Difference Between State & Local Revenues and Expenditures per Immigrant;
- 33rd Median Household Income of Foreign-Born Population;
- 9th Percent of Foreign-Born STEM Workers Out of Total STEM Workers;
- 43rd Percent of Foreign-Born Population Aged 25 & Older with a Bachelor's Degree or Higher;
- 22nd Percent of Fortune 500 Companies Founded by Immigrants or Their Children;
- 25th Percent of Jobs Created by Presence of International Students Out of Total Jobs; and
- Out of Total Jobs; and
 28th Economic Contribution of

Rock Art Academy offered by El Paso Archaeological Society

EL PASO COUNTY – The 2019 Rock Art Academy, a two-day field school that encompasses a trip to Hueco Tanks State Park, will be held Saturday and Sunday, February 16-17, at the El Paso Museum of Archaeology, 4301 Transmountain Rd.

EPAS is partnering with the Texas Archaeological Society's (TAS) to offer the popular Rock Art Academy activities. Interested individuals need no previous archeological experience to attend the

two-day sessions, and will be awarded a certificate of participation.

Registration for the sessions may be completed on TAS's website, at https://txarch.org/. The registration fee is \$100, which includes a TAS membership, two days of instruction, and lunch.

EPAS, founded in 1922, is a non-profit group. Membership is open to individuals and organizations interested in anthropology, archaeology, and in the preservation of prehistoric and historic cultural resources. EPAS members

First Year Teacher Academy prepares new SEISD teachers for the classroom

SAN ELIZARIO – Stepping into a classroom and teaching for the very first time can be quite nerve-wracking for most new teachers but thanks to San Elizario Independent School District's (SEISD) 'First Year Teacher Academy,' teachers can flourish and grow in their profession with ease.

"The life of a first year teacher can be overwhelming because they learn everything from curriculum to Human Resources to technology," said Debbie Cortez, Instructional Officer at SEISD. "Participating in a solid induction program, such as the First Year Teacher Academy, can make the transition a bit easier and provide our teachers with the time and support to succeed."

The goal is to increase teacher effectiveness and higher teacher retention. First year teachers are provided with ongoing professional development throughout the year from the instructional team as well as a seasoned campus mentor.

"I am glad SEISD has this Academy for new teachers because it is definitely helpful and beneficial," said Daniel Morrow, Science teacher at San Elizario High School. "It

El Paso commissioners consider independent redistricting resolution

EL PASO COUNTY – El Paso County Commissioners Court is expected to approve a resolution this week that calls for the creation of an Independent Redistricting Commission (IRC); if so, it will make El Paso the first county in the state of Texas to pass a resolution to support a fair, fully transparent, impartial, and depoliticized process for drawing state legislative and congressional districts.

Theresolution, which is being introduced by newly-elected El Paso County Judge Ricardo Samaniego, calls for the end of the current redistricting process, where state legislators are effectively choosing their own constituents. The redistricting issue is especially pertinent in the state's voting rights laws.

"Now more than ever, we must work to protect democracy and the processes by which district lines are drawn. The voters of this community, and the entire State, deserve a fair and transparent process which gives them confidence in our system of government," stated Samaniego, who took office in January.

"The 2020 Census is upon us and as we work towards not only ensuring populations are accurately counted, so too must we prioritize creating a balanced, transparent and nonpartisan redistricting process. The resolution I am sponsoring for Commissioners Court consideration emphasizes these priorities and reinforces the County's support for a process that is inclusive of those most affected by its outcome, our constituents," Samaniego asserted.

A state-wide organization that is applauding the El Paso county commissioners' move is the Fair Maps of Texas coalition, which is a nonpartisan grassroots effort whose members believe that fair redistricting practices transcend party politics and who are committed to creating an IRC in Texas.

Coalition members are currently trying to raise awareness in their cause and organizing supporters in communities across the state so that they can work with their local government officials to pass similar resolutions.

By approving this resolution, the El Paso county judge and commissioners will send a strong message to the governor and all state legislators that Texans want fair redistricting, according to Stephanie Swanson, lead organizer for Fair Maps Texas.

Swanson stated that Fair Maps Texas



- On Feb. 4, 1938, Walt "Snow Disney releases White and the Seven Dwarfs," his first full-length animated feature production. Naysayers, including his wife, warned him that audiences wouldn't sit through a cartoon fantasy about dwarfs, but the film quickly grossed \$8 million, a staggering sum during the Great Depression.
- On Feb. 5, 1918, the steamship Tuscania, transporting over 2,000 American soldiers bound for Europe, is torpedoed and sinks off the coast of Ireland by the German submarine U-77.
- On Feb. 6, 1891, members of the Dalton Gang stage an unsuccessful train robbery in California – an inauspicious beginning to their careers as serious criminals. Bob, Emmett and Grat Dalton were only three of the 10 Dalton sons. The majority of the Dalton boys became law-abiding citizens, and one served as a deputy U.S. marshal.
- On Feb. 7, 1984, while in orbit 170 miles above Earth, Navy Capt. Bruce McCandless becomes the first human being to fly untethered in space when he exits the U.S. space shuttle Challenger and maneuvers freely. McCandless orbited Earth in tangent with the shuttle at speeds greater than 17,500 mph.
- On Feb. 8, 1990, singersongwriter Del Shannon ("Runaway" and "Hats Off to Larry") commits suicide while in the midst of a comeback. Shannon's widow would later file a high-profile lawsuit against Eli Lilly, the manufacturer of the antidepressant Prozac, which Shannon had begun taking shortly before his suicide.
- On Feb. 9, 1960, Adolph Coors disappears while driving to work from his Morrison, Colorado, home. The grandson of the Coors' founder and chairman of the Golden, Colorado, brewery was kidnapped and held for ransom before being shot to death.
- On Feb. 10, 1763, The Seven Years' War, known as the French and Indian War, ends with the signing of the Treaty of Paris by France, Great Britain and Spain. France lost all claims to Canada and gave Louisiana to Spain, while Britain received Spanish Florida, Upper Canada and various French holdings overseas.

The benefits of aspirin

DEAR DR. ROACH: I recently read an article on the pros and cons of a daily aspirin for protection against both heart disease and colon cancer. This is not a new topic, I realize, and I know that the benefits of daily aspirin apply only to certain segments of the population. Here's my question: If a person doesn't

experience any stomach or bleeding issues, does a much higher dose of aspirin daily also convey the same possibly protective effects? I don't believe that more is better, but I already take an average of nine 325 mg generic aspirin tablets daily for leg pain. I'm in that 50-59 age group, and there is heart disease on both sides of my family, so I'm hoping this



dose confers some cardiac benefit. I would love to find a cure for the deep ache I get in my legs — usually just the right calf. I've had these since I was a child, and I've reconciled myself to the fact that I will have them for the rest of my life, but the aspirin I take has never caused me stomach pain or excessive bleeding, and it works for the pain. — T.P.

The studies showing that taking aspirin protects the heart mostly have been done using 81 mg daily or 325 mg every other day. However, the mechanism of the action, preventing platelets from forming a clot, is even stronger at higher doses, so it would make sense that higher doses would be at least as effective. However, they are much more likely to cause bleeding, even if most people can take higher doses without problems. So it's recommended you take the minimum effective dose to get the benefit with the least harm. In your case, however, I think you are likely getting all the benefit there may be.

I say "may be" because recent studies have failed to replicate the protection seen in earlier studies. I still believe that aspirin is useful in people at higher-than-average risk for heart disease.

More and more evidence is coming out that the same low dose of aspirin helps protect against several forms of cancer, especially of the colon. However, I don't yet recommend it just to protect against cancer, but I will continue to pay careful attention to ongoing studies on aspirin and will revisit this topic when more research becomes available.

DEAR DR. ROACH: In a recent test, my blood vitamin D


