Student debt

With graduation season upon us and student debt at an all-time high, the personal-finance website WalletHub has released a report on the Cities with the Most & Least Student Debt in 2019 (accompanying videos), along with a nationally representative Student Money Survey. WalletHub's editors also picked the Best Credit Cards for 2019 Graduates, to help new college and high school grads build credit and maximize savings. El Paso was in the 31 percentile (1-best; 99-worst) of cities with an average ratio of 33-percent student debt (\$15,327) to earnings of a Bachelor Degree holder (\$46,022). Other findings:

• 45 percent of students say credit card debt worries them more than student loan debt.

• 59 percent of college students say their school is not doing enough to educate them about personal finance.

• One in three college students think they'll be worse off financially than their parents.

TEXAS - With the state legislative session set to end on Memorial Day (May 27), Texas lawmakers are still trying to deliver on two bills that home and business owners, as well as

current and retired educators, anxiously awaiting: are property tax reform and school finance reform.

Senate Bill 2 has been passed by both the House and the Senate and is being refined in a conference committee. The bill is expected to get final approval this week, House and Senate as negotiators meet in an effort to compromise on their differences. Committee members are working to merge the language in Senate Bill 2 and House Bill 2, and then will prepare a conference committee report, which is essentially the combined bill.

House Speaker Dennis Bonnen, a Republican out that both the House and Senate each earmarked \$2.7 billion on property tax reductions funded by the

state and \$3.3 billion on education reforms.

call for an election if property tax revenues rise more than 3.5 percent from the year before. But there are disagreements over the rollback rate for school districts along with community college and hospital districts.

Additionally, many cities, counties and other tax agencies

are against the proposed property tax reform because, they argued, the bill will cost local governments millions of dollars in revenue and limit their ability to provide adequate funding for public safety, schools, and roads.

Regarding the school finance reform, the House and Senate are on different tracks also, when it comes to teacher salary increases. The bill passed in the Senate gives the state's publicschool teachers and librarians an across the board \$5,000 raise, while the House version gives school districts nearly \$1,400 for raises for all employees plus additional incentive pay.

In a recent news interview, Bonnen stated that lawmakers need to show a differential when it comes to using billions of dollars for teacher pay raises. It is unwise "to simply give every teacher the vanilla \$5,000 whether you're working harder or better or in a more difficult environment than anyone else, you get the same amount whether you started yesterday for your first day of teaching and whether you've been doing it for ten years," he stated. "Education is a profession and there is no profession where you pay everyone exactly the same amount regardless of how long they've done it, how well they've done it, and where they're willing to do it."


Lawmakers in the House and Senate also have differences in their efforts to shore up the Teacher Retirement System (TRS), which is responsible for the retirement benefits of the state's 1.6 million current and retired teachers.

The bill passed in the Senate requires the state, school districts, and current teachers to all contribute more to the system. In addition, each retired teacher would receive a state-funded supplemental payment of \$500. Under the Senate version, the state would pay an extra \$542 million.

In the bill passed by the House, each retiree would receive a from Angleton, pointed \$2,400 state-funded supplemental payment, while only the state would contribute more to the TRS. The House bill would cost the state an extra \$1.3 billion. Both versions would enable the TRS to drastically shorten the timeframe to pay off its unfunded liabilities, from 87 years to 30 years.

Bonnen explained that he believed the House version makes The House and Senate agreed that cities and counties could more sense. "When the state asked the school districts locally to put in a contribution on that, we want to reduce property taxes. Well, the reality of it is we're asking that local school district to spend more local tax money to make that payment. So, in

Robocall update FTCwarnsofmoreSocial Security phone scams

Robocall Social Security Administration scams are on the rise. The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) says SSA telephone shakedowns specifically targeting senior citizens now surpass phony IRS calls, according to the Association of Mature American Citizens (AMAC).

For the past few years fake IRS calls topped the list of complaints received by the FTC. "But the new SSA scam is trending in the same direction – with a vengeance. People filed over 76,000 reports about Social Security imposters in the past 12 months, with reported losses of \$19 million," according to the FTC.

AMAC president Dan Weber notes that at its peak, between October 2015 and September 2016, losses from IRS scams reached \$17 million. Meanwhile, in just two months, February and March of this year, the FTC received some 36,000 complaints from individuals who received Social Security calls. And, \$6.7 million in reported losses were logged.

Weber says "these con men are 'phishing' for Social Security numbers that can be used to commit all kinds of online crime. They can use stolen SS accounts to take out loans in your name, leaving you holding the bag. In addition, while they are at it, they often try to extort money from you. Meanwhile, the solution is quite simple - just hang up."

And if you get such a phone call don't fall for the scam even if your caller ID shows that the Social Security Administration is calling you. The SSA does not make threats. In fact, you should never give out your SS number, your bank account number or any such sensitive personal information to anyone who calls you out of the blue - especially if the voice on the other end of the line is a recording.

Dan Weber also recommends that you simply hang up on such callers and then call the SSA at (800) 772-1213 to report the incident. He says the Social Security Administration has issued a procedure notification for those who might receive scam calls, which can be accessed on the https://www.identitytheft.gov/SSA online.

"Robocall scams are fast becoming the methodology of choice for tech-savvy crooks. And, while we are each responsible for protecting ourselves from these criminals, the government has a responsibility, too. To that end, there is legislation in Congress that seeks to address robocall stings."

Booker ranked number two in Open Secrets' Top 20 Senate recipients of the Pharmaceuticals/Health Products industry in 2014 with \$331,300 in contributions. His career total: \$434,774.

my opinion, we should go ahead and do what we did in the House, and cover that for our teachers, school districts because the truth of it is it's all coming from the same pot of money – the back pocket of Texas taxpayers."

The House Speaker said that there's no excuse for the Texas Legislature to not finish its business in regular session. "Everything is set up in conference on HB 3 (school finance reform), in conference on SB 2 (property tax reform), and those are going well and they're productive. The reality of it is there is no good reason for us not to get our work done in the regular session," he stated.

Meanwhile, tax experts are predicting that if the reform bill is passed it may shrink taxes a little bit, but maybe not at all. "No, taxes are not going to go down,"

said Dale Craymer, president of Texas Taxpayers and Research Association. Property owners are "not going to get a bill and see that it's half of what it was last year."

Although the Legislature plans and our retired teachers, and our to infuse at least \$2.7 billion in state revenue to supplant local property taxes, it's not enough to outpace the rapid increase of tax bills driven by increasing values, Craymer stated. "A homeowner may get \$400 of tax relief, but that's against a property tax bill that may be rising \$600," he added.

> For Texas cities, the 3.5% revenue growth cap in Senate Bill 2 will have an immediate impact, because currently cities and counties can increase property tax revenue up to 8% without an election.

But Senate Bill 2 also allows local governments to exceed the cap if they call for an election, which is an option many cities are likely to take, which could wipe out any savings state lawmakers hoped to achieve.





Forget bottled water, tap water is better

DEAR DR. ROACH: Bottled and purified water sales have increased over the years. I often see advertisements showing filters attached to faucets that "take out all impurities." My

parents had a water softener, and my father, professionally involved in weight-bearing physicalactivity, experienced demineralization of his skeleton and a broken hip. It has been suggested that the water softener took minerals, including calcium, out of the water that my parents used to cook and drink. I drink tap water, but



is a large percentage of the U.S. population headed for demineralization and malnutrition because they drink only "purified water"? – C.D.

Most water softeners work by exchanging sodium for the "hard" minerals, especially magnesium and calcium, present in most tap water, to greater or lesser extent. If the water in your area is naturally very hard, then a significant amount of sodium may be added, and calcium and magnesium removed.

However, this is very rarely a problem, and almost certainly had nothing to do with why your father had a hip fracture. We get our minerals mostly from food, not from water. The major risk factors for osteoporosis in men are smoking, alcohol, low testosterone levels and low vitamin D, although there are many other causes.

I don't recommend bottled water or water purifiers because in most of the United States and Canada, the water quality is excellent. Bottled water is 1,000 times more expensive than tap water where I live. I have been to places where the tap water doesn't taste so good, in which case I would recommend a filter over bottled water.

DEAR DR. ROACH: Could you please discuss the use of Propecia for female hair loss? I am a female in my late 50s, and I have suffered from hair loss for many years. After numerous blood tests, a biopsy and exams, my dermatologist determined that I have androgenic alopecia. I have been on Aldactone, and have used minoxidil for quite a while, with minimal results, if any. For the past eight months, I have been taking Propecia, 2.5 mg daily. My hair doesn't seem any better or worse, but I worry


