Qualified nominees must be native Texans or five-year residents of the state. Candidates must have received recognition for high levels of excellence and success in their respective disciplines. They also must have received critical reviews in state, regional, or national publications.

Chosen artists will join the company of previous state artists – such as Willie Nelson, Beili Liu, and Kathy Vargas – and will receive statewide recognition.

Texas State Legislature's 2019 and 2020 appointments to the positions of state poet laureate, state musician, state two-dimensional artist and state three-dimensional artist were: 2019 State Musician was Little Joe Hernandez, who helped pioneer Tejano music, a mix of traditional norteño music and country, blues, and rock styles. 2020 State Musician was Emily Gimble, who has been singing and playing on-stage since she was seven years old and comes from a long line of family guitar pickers.

2019 State Poet Laureate was Carrie Fountain, whose poems have appeared in Tin House, Poetry, and The New Yorker, among others. 2020 State Poet Laureate was Emmy Perez, who is the author of the poetry collections, With the River on Our Face and Solstice. She is a member of the Macondo Writers Workshop and is a former recipient of poetry fellowships from the National Endowment for the Arts, Canto Mundo, and the New York Foundation for the Arts.

2019 State Visual Artist (two-dimensional) was Mary McCleary, who makes collages of great complexity that combine painterly craftsmanship and striking

> During their year-long tenure, Texas State Artists participate in TCA events and promotions, including participation on TCA's Texas Touring Roster and other state initiatives in relation to their respective arts discipline.

> Although the state artists recognition program has been going on for many decades, El Paso County's only state recognized artists have been – in 1968, when Sybil Leonard Armes was named alternate poet laureate behind Kathryn Henry Harris, of Waco; and in 1995 when Frederick Carter was selected state visual artist winner, according to data on TCA's website.

> "We are fortunate to have many outstanding artists in Texas, and we anticipate receiving numerous qualified nominations," said Gary Gibbs, executive director of TCA. "Being named a Texas State Artist is the Texas Legislature's highest honor for an artist, and it brings new career opportunities and recognition from the arts community and the general public."

> TCA oversees the selection process for the four positions, in accordance with Chapter 3104 of the Texas Government Code. TCA issues the call for nominations, oversees an evaluation review process, and provides a list of finalists to the selection committee.

PASO COUNTY – Following EL guidance from the El Paso Department of Public Health to help limit the spread of COVID-19 in the community, the Socorro Independent School District began instruction for its more than 47,000 students via remote learning on August 17, 2020. When the health order expires on September 7, 2020, the district transitioning students, and staff, safely and cautiously back to school beginning on September 8, 2020 and continue phasing in students for on-campus instruction through September 28, 2020.

Remote (at-home) learning will continue to be an option throughout the 2020-2021 school year for all families who have chosen remote instruction for their child.

TEA waiver to extend transition period beyond four weeks

District administration proactively plans to implement a phased approach to requested and received approval of a Texas Education Agency waiver allowing for the extension of the at-home learning transition period. As mandated by TEA, the waiver requested an "indication as

to the local health conditions that would warrant a faster end to the transition period, so that all students have access to on-campus instruction."

The district followed the guidance of City and County Health Authority Dr. Hector I. Ocaranza to indicate which parameters would warrant a safe return to parents and employees to the best of

the safe reopening of schools.

"The parameters previously stated have shown a continuous downward trend in the pandemic indicating that the spread of

COVID-19 in our community has slowed down to a level that can be considered as an indicator for return of in-person instruction on campus, in a safe and cautious manner, on or after September 8, 2020," Dr. Ocaranza said in a memo to school district leaders.

Phased reopening plan

To be in compliance with the TEA waiver requirements as well as the guidance by the local Department of Public Health, Socorro ISD has updated its reopening plans to include a phased-in approach that reflects Dr. Ocaranza's recommendation "for return of in-person instruction on campus, in a safe and cautious manner." 

Students unable to connect remotely

The first group of students to return to campus are those who have been served through solely an asynchronous learning model due to lack of internet access. As mandated by TEA, these students shall be provided the opportunity to receive instruction on campus during the district's transition period.

School personnel have identified students who are not able to connect remotely and have worked diligently to accommodate them with offline learning opportunities through September 4, 2020. Beginning September 8, 2020, they will be given the opportunity to participate in online remote learning on their campus where a device


may God ease the pain of his children for witnessing what their father instigated.

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2020 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for TOWN OF ANTHONY from the same properties in both the 2019 tax year and the 2020 tax year.

The voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate that TOWN OF ANTHONY may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate, unless the de minimis rate for TOWN OF ANTHONY exceeds the voter-approval tax rate for TOWN OF ANTHONY.

The de minimis rate is the rate equal to the sum of the no-new-revenue maintenance and operations rate for TOWN OF ANTHONY, the rate that will raise \$500,000, and the current debt rate for TOWN OF ANTHONY.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that TOWN OF ANTHONY is not proposing to increase property taxes for the 2020 tax year.

A public hearing on the proposed tax rate will be held on September 14, 2020 at 6:30 PM at Town Hall, 401 Wildcat Drive, Anthony, Texas 79821 (open to the public at 6:30 pm); members of the public may also communicate with Council during the public hearing by calling the following number (915) 886-3944 during office hours of 8:00 am to 4:30 pm or emailing Norma Gonzalez at ngonzalez@townofanthony.org to participate virtually.

The proposed tax rate is greater than the voter-approval tax rate, but not greater than the de minimis rate. However, the proposed tax rate exceeds the rate that allows voters to petition for an election under Section 26.075, Tax Code. If TOWN OF ANTHONY adopts the proposed tax rate, the qualified voters of the TOWN OF ANTHONY may petition the TOWN OF ANTHONY to require an election to be held to determine whether to reduce the proposed tax rate. If a majority of the voters reject the proposed tax rate, the tax rate of the TOWN OF ANTHONY will be the voter-approval tax rate of the TOWN OF ANTHONY.

Under one scenario he would have turned around and attacked the officers, or he would have taken off, which would have resulted in a high speed chase with young kids in the car.

The problem is that many people, including athletes, are looking at both these incidents the exact same way.

And until all of us act rationally and wait for all the facts to come in, we'll continue to have needless riots in the streets.

Honestly, I don't care what the facts say, as long as the facts are followed and justice is administered fairly.



Pulmonary fibrosis needs exact diagnosis

DEAR DR. ROACH: My husband was recently diagnosed with mild to moderate pulmonary fibrosis. His mother died from

pulmonary fibrosis. From what we have read there is no cure, only palliative care. The thought of doing nothing to try to stop the progression is totally unacceptable when there have been such successes with immunotherapy and stem cells. Would he receive more aggressive treatment going to a pulmonary fibrosis care center that has lung disease programs? – C.D.



There are several diseases that may cause fibrosis of the lung, so having an exact diagnosis made by an expert is critical for getting the right treatment. The most common type of pulmonary fibrosis is called "idiopathic pulmonary fibrosis" (it also has been called "usual interstitial pneumonia" and "cryptogenic fibrosing alveolitis"), and I am going to discuss that diagnosis.

The cause of IPF is unknown (both "idiopathic" and "cryptogenic" mean "of unknown cause"), but cigarette smoking is a risk factor. It is usually diagnosed in people who are their 50s and 60s, although some familial cases may come on earlier. IPF can run in families.

Although it is a rare disease, it seems to be on the rise. The major symptoms are cough and shortness of breath.

There is no cure for IPF, but there are treatments available. Two drugs, pirfenidone and nintedanib, are approved for use in the U.S. and Canada. Both of them slow progression of lung disease, reduce exacerbations and have been proven to reduce mortality from the condition, if only slightly. I am concerned that you and your husband apparently haven't heard of these drugs.


I strongly advise you get a referral to a center for lung disease in order to get your husband the best care. I found 35 IPF trials recruiting patients in the U.S. and six in Canada. A clinical trial will help scientists understand this condition as well as determine the best current treatment. You also can find out what centers have expertise on this condition by seeing where the trials are conducted at www.clinicaltrials.gov. The most aggressive treatment isn't always the best, but you and your husband deserve to hear about all the options.

DEAR DR. ROACH: My niece recently was diagnosed with breast cancer. Radiation was recommended. Her mother said that first she'd have to boost her immune system. Is it possible to actually do that? – P.P.L.

Radiation is a common treatment after breast cancer surgery. It's done to reduce the risk of recurrence, depending on the exact type of cancer.

Boosting the immune system is a new adjunct for many types of cancer. There are several ways to do this: One is to genetically modify the patient's own immune T-cells, but many other techniques are in trials now.

Making sure your niece has proper nutrition, gets good sleep and experiences as little stress as is manageable are ways to prevent stress on the immune system. 


