UTEP students compete in tech tournament

UTEP bests other Texas teams including UT Austin and Texas A&M

EL PASO COUNTY - A team of six University of Texas at El Paso (UTEP) students recently showed their mettle by placing among the elite eight at the first annual Hack the Madness cybersecurity tournament. The competition, modeled after the NCAA basketball tournament, started with 64 teams from colleges and universities across the United States and organized in regional brackets.

"Cybersecurity is a rapidly growing field and UTEP is one of the industry's leading universities," said Baltazar Santaella, who is the team's supervisor and UTEP's deputy chief information security officer. "To have our students participate and perform at an elite level is a testament to their teamwork, discipline, and the excellent cybersecurity education they Mason Bishop receive at UTEP," he added.

Hack The Box, a leading cybersecurity performance center, hosted the competition. Beyond being a means for friendly competition, the event served as an opportunity to educate and develop future cybersecurity professionals – a field where employment is projected to grow by 33 percent by 2033, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

The UTEP team consisted of undergraduate students including Mason Bishop, Andrea Davila, Damon Fernandez, Brianna Flores, Daniel Fuentes and Luis Fuentes. Over the course of two weekends, the UTEP team, comprised of student employees from across the University's information technology department, competed against other universities in challenges that tested students' abilities in forensics and hacking through events that ranged from real-world incident response scenarios to strategic cyber defense exercises, according to UTEP officials.

"The opportunity to compete in Hack the Madness fueled my passion for cybersecurity even further," said Daniel Fuentes, a senior and computer science major. "Working alongside my talented teammates, while representing UTEP on the national stage and in a high-pressure environment, built my confidence

Public broadcasting lived past its time

Big Bird deserved to lose this time.

In the past, whenever Republicans have tried to cut federal funding for public broadcasting, the 8-foot-2-inch-tall yellow bird has been trotted out as an exemplar of all that is good and necessary about public broadcasting, and the federal dollars were preserved.

Our Jim Henson-created feathered friend could not continue his undefeated streak. A Trump-backed recessions bill was the best chance to defund public broadcasting in decades – and it did – being signed into law on June 24.

The bill, clawing back previously appropriated funding, passed both the House and Senate. The measure targeted \$9.4 billion in federal spending, including around \$1.1 billion in funds for the proliferation of sources of news and entertainment, Corporation for Public Broadcasting.

The CPB previously received about \$500 million a up a few select year from the federal government, and parceled it out media to NPR, PBS and local public radio and TV stations. How much more

NPR maintained that it only gets about 2% of its ridiculous it funding from the federal government, with more coming indirectly via member stations. PBS gets about 15% of its funding from the feds.

If NPR and programming is as necessary as its defenders say, it shouldn't be a heavy lift to get foundations, philanthropists and devoted listeners and viewers to fill in the funding gap. The organization's already given out a lot of tote bags during fundraising drives. Surely, they can give out some more.

and proved to me that I can perform when the stakes are high and that I can compete with the best in the country."

UTEP team's eighth place finish was also the highest ranking among other groups from Texas including UT Austin, UT San Antonio, UT Rio Grande Valley, Texas A&M Corpus Christi and Laredo College. Making it to the Final Four were the University of Maryland Global Campus, the University of Central Florida, Arizona State University, and Western Governors University.

"Unlike many of the other schools we matched up against, our team didn't have a history of competing, said Brianna Flores, a rising senior and computer science student. "For us, Hack The Madness was a way of showing that the knowledge and skills we gain at UTEP are hands-on and prepare us to be the leaders in cybersecurity."

Moments in time

- On Aug. 4, 2012, in London, Oscar Pistorius of South Africa became the first amputee to compete at the Olympic Games. He finished second out of five runners in the opening heat and went on to the semifinals, where he finished eighth out of eight runners.
- On Aug. 5, 1951, 38-year-old Canadian daredevil William "Red" Hill Jr. attempted to go over Niagara Falls in a barrel made of 13 rubber innertubes, canvas webbing and fish netting that he dubbed "the Thing." It broke apart under the high water pressure two hours after he set out, but his badly injured body was not recovered until the next morning.
- On Aug. 6, 1975, The New York Times printed a front-page obituary for Agatha Christie's Belgian sleuth Hercule Poirot quite the honorfor a fictional character! Christie had announced her decision to dispose of him in her next book; indeed, as the Times noted, "The news of his death, given by Dame Agatha, was not unexpected. Word that he was near death reached here last May."
- On Aug. 7, 1967, the U.S. Congress overwhelmingly approved the Gulf of Tonkin Resolution, giving President Lyndon B. Johnson nearly unlimited power to oppose "communist aggression" in Southeast Asia and marking the beginning of America's expanded military role in the battlefields of Vietnam, Laos and Cambodia.

A tax rate of \$0.087138 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of EL PASO COUNTY EMERGENCY SERVICES DISTRICT #2.





PSAs and DREs help identify cancer

DEAR DR. ROACH: I am a 53-year-old healthy male, and I always request to check my PSA levels each year. My

57-year-old brother's new doctor denied his request for a routine PSA check on their initial visit. She said that the test now produces more false positives as well as unnecessary procedures and surgeries, so she said "no" and wouldn't order it. Are primary care physicians discouraging the test for older men now? I



don't get any push back when I request to check it. Also, I heard the digital rectal exam (DRE) isn't as valid anymore for screening. His new doctor also did not do a DRE. I'm curious to know your thoughts on the current DRE and PSA screening guidelines for primary care physicians. – C.C.

The prostate-specific antigen (PSA) test is a screening blood test for cancer, and the recommendation for its use has gone back and forth over decades since it's been introduced. Since screening and prevention are my areas of expertise, I have followed the literature on the use of PSAs and other screening tests very closely.

In my opinion, your brother's doctor was wrong to refuse to order the test. She was right that it does produce false positives, which could potentially lead to unnecessary surgeries; however, there are good ways to reduce unnecessary treatment while still ordering the test, which can save lives.

Most prostate cancer is so slow-growing that it is likely never to bother a man until he dies from something else. So, we don't want to operate on these relatively indolent cancers because there's a possibility of a serious side effect from surgery, such as urinary incontinence or erectile dysfunction (neither of which any man wants).

Before operating, careful testing is done on the prostate cancer, including imaging (ideally by an MRI scan), a biopsy with pathological examination, and often genetic testing of the tumor. Along with the PSA results, we can separate prostate cancer into categories of very low risk and low risk versus intermediate and high risk.

Once we have the diagnosis, we can make good recommendations so that we can identify the rare high-risk cancers while not unnecessarily treating the low-risk cancers. Without screenings, we can't keep rare, small and aggressive tumors from spreading until it's too late.


Now I have to tell you that 57 isn't so much "older" than 53, at least from the perspective of prostate cancer screening. The most important time for prostate cancer screening is ages 50-70. There are some men who benefit from starting screening at a younger age (those with a family history, Black men, and men with certain genetic risks), and there are some who benefit from starting screening when they're older than 70.

The DRE does not add much to the results of the blood test. Approximately 1% of men will get prostate cancer that is diagnosed by the DRE as part of combined screening. Many men will refuse screening if it includes a rectal exam, and it's estimated that 90% of abnormal rectal exams will be false positives. On the other hand, I've had instances where quite a few men don't feel like they have been adequately screened unless they get the DRE.

I have a discussion with every man about PSA testing, and I recommend it for most men in this age group. But I only rarely have had a man say that he doesn't want it once he understands that we won't recommend surgery unless the combination of all the studies show this is a high-risk situation.


