Educators partner with El Paso Zoo to offer interactive exhibits at 21st Annual Chihuahuan Desert Fiesta

EL PASO COUNTY – The public is invited to explore the Chihuahuan Desert through various exhibits and discovery tables that will be presented by local organizations and educators at the 21st Annual Chihuahuan Desert Fiesta.

The festive event will be held from 10:30 a.m. to 3 p.m., Saturday, September 27th, at the El Paso Zoo (4001 East Paisano). The 35-acre park, which houses over 220 species including a few endangered animals, is home to wildlife critters from four geographical regions – those from the Chihuahuan Desert, others from Africa and Asia, as well as some from the Americas.

The Chihuahuan Desert Fiesta was initiated by the Chihuahuan Desert Education Coalition (CDEC) in 2004 and has been growing in popularity throughout the years, according to Rick LoBello, a CDEC member and fiesta coordinator.

CDEC has also been instrumental in organizing the Poppies Fest that is held yearly in the Spring at the foothills of the Franklin Mountains next to the El Paso Archeology Museum fairgrounds.

Additionally, CDEC played a major role in gaining support for the establishment of Castner Range as a national monument. The range encompasses more than 6,600 acres of land along the Franklin Mountains' eastern slopes and was designated an American landmark in 2023.

The siren song of despair

Charlie Kirk was a one-man answer to campus illiberalism. He rose to prominence at a time when university administrators and progressive students were working in league to make campuses no-go zones for conservatives.

They effectively banned them from their faculties. They didn't invite them on campus, or if they did, they were liable to disinvite and cancel them. They banned so-called hate speech. They shouted down speakers they didn't like. They created "safe spaces." In short, they did everything they could to render the opposing point of view illegitimate and indefensible.

Kirk showed not only that it was possible to punch through these obstacles and get a hearing, but to win the argument despite them.

He created a student movement that he leveraged into a huge, multifaceted organization and that he mobilized to vote in 2024, to great political effect.


He was provocative, occasionally outlandish and sometimes wrong, but always interesting and doing drew on some

All of the best, most creative college deans could have gotten together to figure out how to routinely get thousands of energized students to events about public affairs, and never managed it. No worries. Kirk figured it out for them. That he was shot while he engaged in an act of peaceful persuasion makes his murder all the more devastating.

Kirk wasn't a literary figure, but his assassination was a little like, say, William F. Buckley or James

Baldwin getting gunned down in the midst of their famous 1965 debate at the Cambridge Union.



Moments

- On Sept. 22, 1888, National Geographic magazine published its first issue, without photos. The publication had so few subscribers that its editor, Gilbert H. Grosvenor, addressed each copy and carried them to the post office himself.
- On Sept. 23, 1992, Manon Rheaume became the first woman to play in one of the four major men's North American pro sports leagues when she stepped on the ice as goalie for the NHL's Tampa Bay Lightning in a preseason game. Admitting to being "very nervous," she also noted that part of her admission was "for publicity," but added that it was "still a chance to play. That's what I care about."
- On Sept. 24, 1902, cookbook author Fannie Farmer, who changed the way Americans prepared food by advocating for the use of standardized measurements in recipes, opened Miss Farmer's School of Cookery in Boston. Farmer not only taught women how to cook, but later instructed medical professionals on nutrition for the sick.

On Sept. 25, 1890, religious leaders issued the "Mormon

Manifesto," which ordered all Latter-day Saints to uphold America's anti-polygamy laws. The men were given little choice in the decision, as they faced federal confiscation of their temples and revocation of church members' basic civil rights for failure to comply.

- 26, 1996. On Sept. biochemist and U.S. astronaut Shannon Lucid returned to Earth in the U.S. Space Shuttle Atlantis after six months in orbit aboard the Russian space station Mir. She was the first American woman to live in a space station.
- On Sept. 27, 622, the prophet Muhammad completed his Hegira, or "flight," from Mecca to Medina to escape persecution. In Medina, he set about building the followers of his religion, Islam, into an organized community and Arabian power. The Hegira would later mark the beginning of the Muslim calendar.
- On Sept. 28, 1850, Congress voted to end flogging on both naval and merchant vessels. Until then, seamen were often punished by being stripped to the waist and subjected to lashes on their backs with whips called cat-o'-nine-tails.





Oral contraceptive risk is controversial topic

DEAR DR. ROACH: I want to point out a serious health concern. My daughter turned 40 last year had a mammogram

that came back with a shocking diagnosis stage 3 microinvasive carcinoma. She underwent three surgeries, the last of which was a double mastectomy. I read that cancer incidence increases with hormone usage that is greater than five years in a row. My daughter's doctor prescribed "the pill" to her



for much greater than five years and never even warned her of the risk. How many other women are unaware of the risks? In many cases, these women are busy, young professionals as my daughter is. They are using the pill because it is so easy. Please warn them and their parents. -M.R.

The association of combined oral contraceptives with breast cancer is controversial. Many large studies, such as the Nurses' Health Study, didn't find an association between "the pill" with breast cancer, either while a woman is using it or after she stops.

There have been some studies that have shown an increase in risk, but the magnitude of the risk is small. In a large Danish study, the overall increase in risk was about one additional case of breast cancer in 8,000 women taking the pill for a year. For women under 35, the risk was one case in 50,000 women per year. The studies that showed a risk for breast cancer did not show an increased risk when women took them for longer.

Oral contraceptives certainly have risks. Blood clots are more common among users. They have side effects that can be very bothersome and sometimes prevent women from using them. However, there is an overall improvement in mortality risk among users because even in 2025, having a baby puts a mother's life at risk, and oral contraceptives are effective at preventing pregnancy.

DEAR DR. ROACH: I am a healthy male, age 65. I get 7-8 hours of sleep most nights, but during the night, I typically wake up three to four times with a very full bladder. So, I use the bathroom, then return to bed. My question is, where do my kidneys get all the water to make so much urine? I'm not drinking during the night, and I don't drink anything before I go to sleep. Where is it coming from? This does not happen during my waking hours. -B.F.

When you drink or even eat food with a high water content, this fluid will be absorbed into your blood, but it takes time. Once it's in your blood, it will then be filtered by your kidneys to make urine, but this, too, takes time.

In general, I tell my patients to stop drinking 4 hours or more before bedtime. People who have kidneys that aren't at 100% function may need an even longer time so that they can urinate all the fluid out.

There are other considerations. Many men and women over 60 develop swollen legs during the day due to leaky blood vessels and valves in the veins. Taking in excess salt worsens this problem. The fluid will go back into the blood overnight, and it can easily be enough fluid to fill the bladder. Compression stockings can reduce the amount of fluid in the legs.

Finally, the body has a system for reducing urine output at night (the anti-diuretic hormone is secreted at night to prevent you from having to get up), and in some people, this system fails. The hormone can be given nasally in these cases, but since it can affect blood sodium levels, it needs to be used very judiciously.





Unscramble these twelve letter strings to form each into an ordinary word (ex. HAGNEC becomes CHANGE). Prepare to use only ONE word from any marked (♥) letter string as each unscrambles into more than one word (ex. ♥ RATHE becomes HATER or EARTH or HEART). Fit each string's word either across or down to knot all twelve strings together.
